northern Mississippi along what could well be called Hereford Highway. Here are some of the nation's outstanding ranches, providing all sections of the nation with top quality cattle.

To Mr. Moore, as he advised Lancaster Farming, the purebred cattle business in the East is a bit new, "and correct management must be impressed in people's minds, there's a need for business experience here."

Good business experience, one might add, such as was exemplified in Monday's sale of the EPHA.

"Prices there didn't equal those Mr. Moore has experienced, in fact one of his bulls sold for almost \$14,000 more than all 50 head totaled in Monday's auction, a \$47,000 record in the breed at the time.

In the Hereford Register of Value, CMR stands on top. Look at this record, as furnished by Mr. Moore: In 1954, CMR averaged \$5,061 on its Polled Hereford bulls; in Feb. this year, the sale of bulls averaged \$4,228. A year ago, the nation's Polled Hereford sales were topped by Mr. Moore's CMR average of \$4,878.

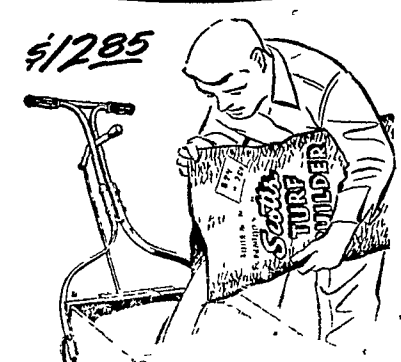
