Two will be awarded on Lancaster County, one in Mifflin county. If the number of applicants is insufficient, the scholarships will be offered in other counties.

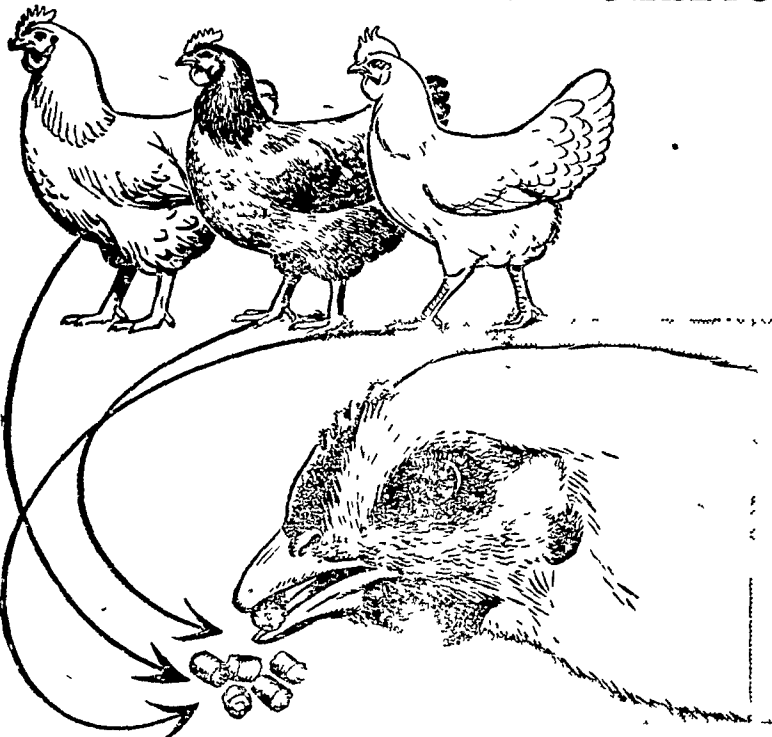
FOX BITES FIVE

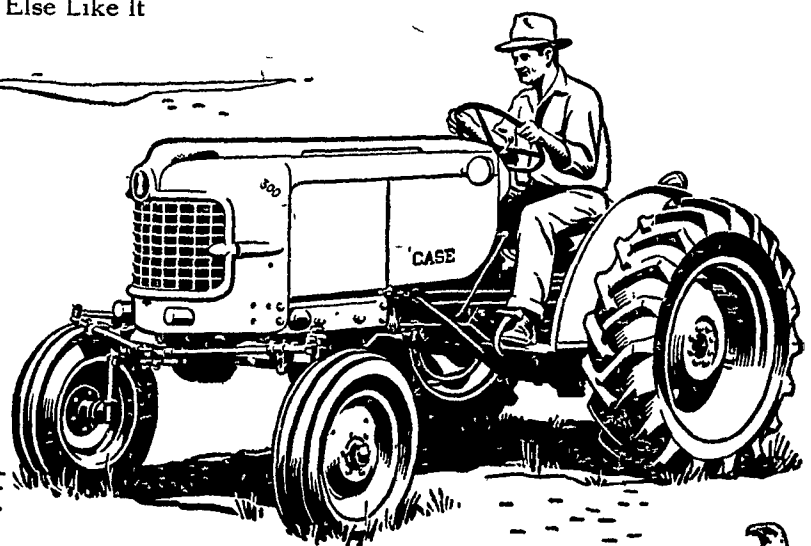
