Chicken Barbecue Business Booming

It's barbecued chicken season again when tons and ton of Lancaster County broilers will be served from charcoal pits under tasty barbecue sauce. Reviewing the past season, a representative of one Lancaster County chicken barbecuing firm reports last year they served 43,000 halves — or 26.87 tons — in Lancaster, York and Chester counties. Biggest event served by Jacob C. Hess, Gordonville, and his crew, was 7,000 at the County Poultry barbecue in Lititz last year. Preferred are broilers two and one-half to two and three-quarters pounds, which may be split and cooked on special quantity-size equipment. Chicken barbecues have given one of the biggest boosts the industry has ever known.

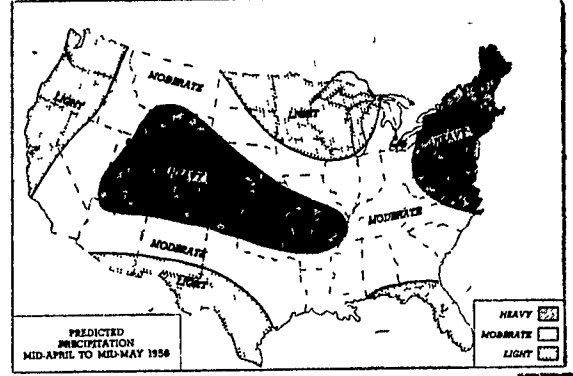
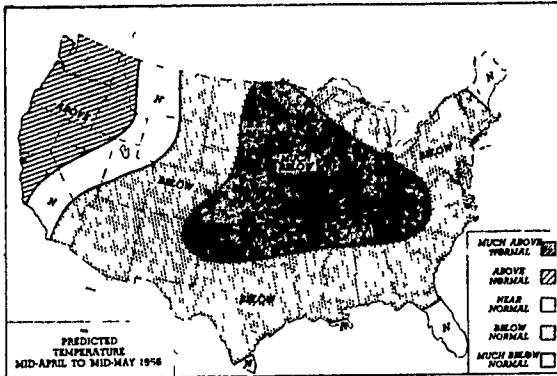

Outlook for Mid-April to Mid-May, 1956



The Weather Bureau's 30-day outlook for the period from mid-April to mid-May calls for temperatures to average below seasonal normals in the eastern three-quarters of the United States, with greatest departures in the Mid-West. Above normal temperatures are indicated in the Pacific Northwest and near normal else-

where. Precipitation is expected to exceed normal in the North and Middle Atlantic States, the Central Plains, and the Central Mountain States. Subnormal amounts are predicted along the West Coast, in the Rio Grande and Upper Mississippi Valleys, and over Florida. In other areas near normal rainfall is anticipated.
