PETERBOROUGH, N. H. — With the completion of the key Wednesday program, final plans for the 79th annual meeting convention of the American Guernsey Cattle Club have been released.

The AGCC meeting will be in Philadelphia, Pa. and vicinity, May 7-10, with the Pennsylvania and Delaware Guernsey Breeders Associations as hosts.

The complete program for Wednesday, May 9, will be held in the Bellevue-Stratford hotel, beginning at 10 that morning with the annual business meeting of the American Guernsey Cattle Club. The annual meeting luncheon, and afternoon sightseeing tours of historic Philadelphia will follow.

In the evening, a varied program will be held. This will include a reception, musical program, stage show, dinner and dance.

The entertainment will be sponsored by Breuninger Dairies of Philadelphia, whose chorus will sing, and by a group of Pennsylvania Guernsey breeders including James D. Berry, Jr., Titusville, J. H. Bradshaw, Jr., Lahaska; Mrs. Jean L. A. Dupont, Newton Square; H. H. McConnell, Merion; Col. Charles P. O'Connor, West Chester; Mrs. S. C. Price, Hazleton; and M. Ebert Rutter, York

Penn State Begins Two-Year Program

A new two-year program, leading to a new degree, that of "Associate" will be started at the Pennsylvania State University in the College of Agriculture, with the Fall semester. The new program is designed to provide the technical training in a variety of fields associated with agriculture, Dr. D. R. McClay, director of short courses, said.

The new two-year program is expected to meet part of the swelling demand for trained personnel in the many business allied with agriculture, Dr. McClay said. In the new program, students select those courses in the agricultural sciences best aimed at meeting their individual needs. Only English, physical education, and the regular military training courses are required.

Students interested should apply for admission as soon as possible, Dr. McClay pointed out. A new booklet describing the new program can be obtained from his office.

Chickweed Threat Now Looms Here

H. S. Sloat, associate Lancaster County agent, warns that chickweed is making a strong, healthy appearance after a quiet winter on lawns where inadequate attention was given the weed last fall.

A hardy annual, it grows all winter long if the ground is not frozen. This winter's cold delayed growth of the plant until the sudden arrival of summer made it appear literally overnight.

Spraying Chloride PC in November or December is advised, but according to Mr Sloat "The only thing to do now is to keep your lawn mowed and clip it off; it will go to seed and die down shortly, and come up again in mid-August. Fall is the time for control."

Vets May Reinstate Insurance

Lapsed GI term insurance still may be reinstated before the end of the term period, Howard J. Kohl, Contact Officer of the Veterans Administration Regional Office at Wilkes-Barre, has reported in answer to numerous inquiries.

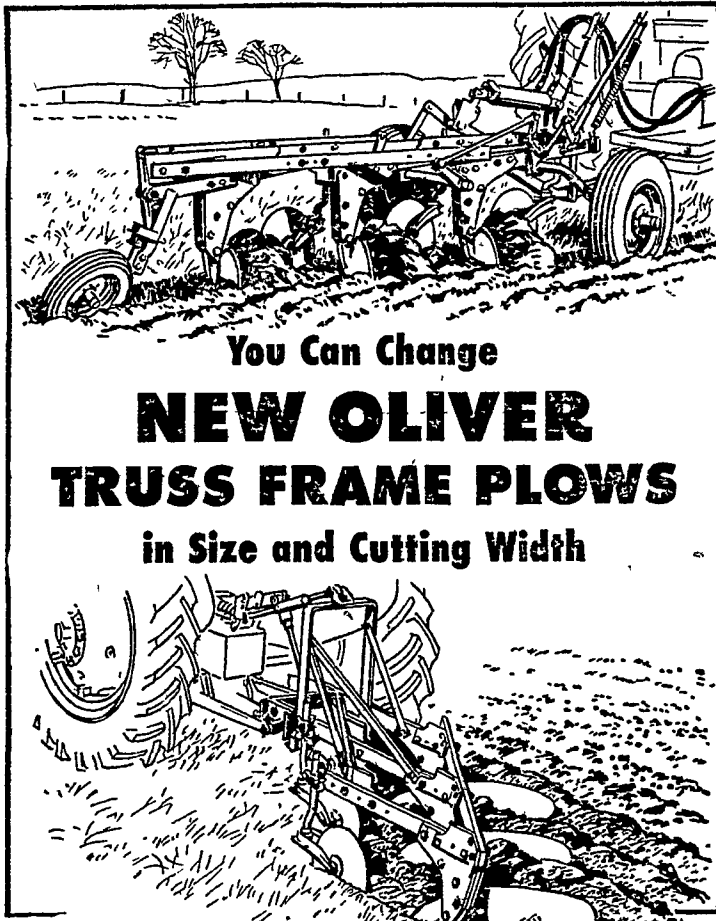
"VA has found that many veterans believe they no longer are entitled to GI insurance payments on 5-year term policies," Kohl said.

He explained that if the 5-year term period has not expired, the

policies may be reinstated with the payment of two monthly premiums.

A medical examination is required if the policies have been lapsed more than three months; but none is required if the policies have been lapsed less than three months and the policyholders are in as good health as they were on the date of lapse, Kohl said.
