Broiler Test Draws Record 733 Entrants

HARRISBURG, Pa. — Key representatives of Pennsylvania's \$23 million broiler industry will gather at Hollidaysburg on May 15th for the selection of the champion chickens of 1956.

The occasion is the state finals of the 10th annual Junior Chicken-of-Tomorrow Contest, sponsored by the State Poultry Federation to encourage production of better meat-type chickens. A record entry list of 733 farm youngsters are competing.

Mrs. George M. Leader, wife of the Governor, will present plaques, ribbons and cash awards to the champion, reserve champion and top placings. Dr. William L. Henning, State Secretary of Agriculture, will speak to the contestants and poultry industry representatives.

Broiler Barbecue

The awards will be made at a broiler barbecue, and the Federation will also make a special citation to Howard C. Pierce of the A & P Food Stores, who originated the state and national Chicken-of-Tomorrow contests. Dr. Pierce is the poultry research director of A & P.

Dr. E I Robertson, Lancaster, chairman of the contest, said: "We feel our annual competition has stimulated interest in better broilers and has been an important factor in the impressive growth of Pennsylvania's broiler industry."

"Federal-state crop reporting service statistics show that broiler production has increased 360 per cent during the 10-year span," Dr. Robertson said. "Last year we produced more than 31,000,000 birds, and we expect 1956 will be even higher."

Auctions at the five regional contest sites — Hollidaysburg, Coates, Franconia, Mandata and Butler — will conclude the contest to sell all entries in lots of 12 birds. Regional judgments prior to the finals will send a total of 38 lots for the state placings.

Judges for the state finals will be Mr. Pierce and H. L. Shrader and Lester Kilpatrick, both of the poultry division of the U. S. Department of Agriculture in Washington, D. C.

Dr. Robertson said that individuals and representatives of clubs or organizations are invited to participate in the auctions as well as commercial buyers.

"It is a fine opportunity to obtain excellent birds and to encourage these youngsters who are learning to become full-time poultrymen," he said. "Proceeds are returned to the boys and girls."

Plaques will be awarded through 10th place and ribbons will go to regional placings. Last year's winner, 13-year-old Sara Ann Herr of Rohrerstown, will be attempting to retain the state crown.

The Altoona Region auction will be held after the barbecue on Tuesday, May 15, at Lakemont Park, Altoona, Pa. The other four auctions, all scheduled for 10 a. m. on Wednesday, May 16, are: Butler Egg Auction at Butler, 140 lots; Producers Cooperative Exchange at Coatesville, 247 lots; Longacre Dressing Plant at Franconia, 61 lots; Susquehanna Locker Plant at Sunbury, 121 lots.
