Other items sold included a tobacco ladders and wagon \$34 and \$61, endless belt \$40, electric drill \$35.

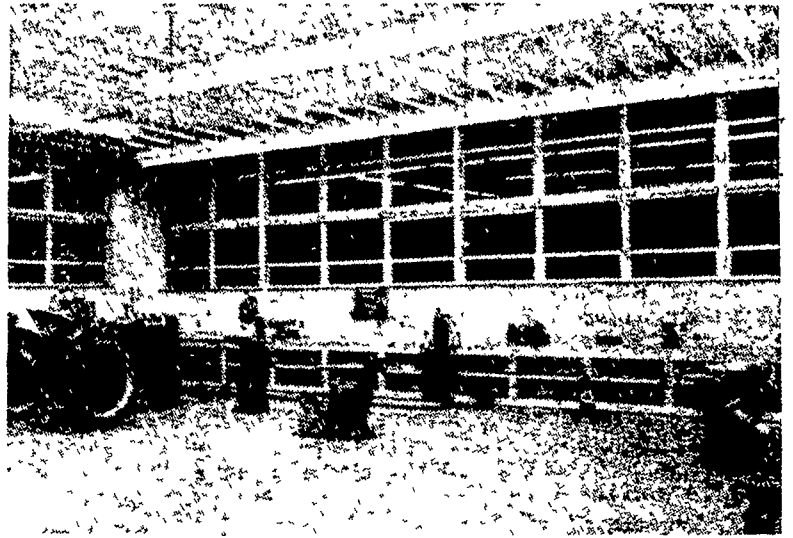
HEROISM EXPENSIVE

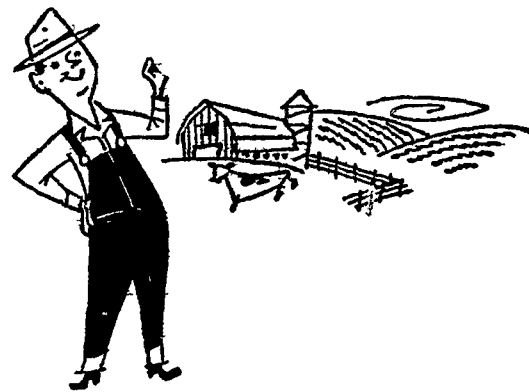
LOCAL NEWS FROM THE AMERICAN GUERNSEY CLUB
