III. owner, at Gwynedd Valley, Pa. took the reserve grand champion cow for \$1,450. She was lot 19 of the Nov. 7, 1954 Brookside Barbara 5th, consigned by Brookside Farm, Whitmarsh, Pa. A daughter of Bardoliermere of Den-Mor, she was one of the Brookside Show calves.

The reserve champion female, lot 37, the April 23, 1955 Millarden Blackbird 8th, sold for \$1,200 to Joe Sherman's Karimar Farms at Hawthorne, Pa. Consigned by Millarden Farms, Annville, Pa., she sold with

breeding privileges to Ankonian O. B. 13th, the 1955 International grand champion bull, whose services were much in demand at the sale. She was a daughter of Eileenmere of Woodbarr out of Ankony Blackbird 38th.

Colorado Firm Buys

Another female in the \$1,000-or-more category was lot 46 Rowan Enchantress 7th, consigned by Rowan Stock Farm, Landenberg, Pa., calved July 19, 1954, that sold to Haystack Angus Ranch, Longmont, Colo.

Prices on bulls were lower than expected, and a top of \$450 was scored on the grand champion of the show, lot 2, Royal Bandolier RWN, calved Sept. 1, 1954. Consigned by Robinwood Farm, Camp Hill, Pa., she sold to Glenden Farms, Robert N. Downs, owner, Wilmington, Del. The lot 1 bull, Eileenmere of Ash Grove, consigned by Ash Grove Farm, New Hope, Pa., sold to Mark Hosler, R3 Manheim, one of the Lancaster County buyers, for \$400.

Many sales were not up to par pricewise. There was a lack of buyers, and a lack of the more popular families, and some animals went at what could be considered beef prices. Another factor that hindered

the sale was that this was one of the last auctions of the spring season.

Sales were made into Pennsylvania, Delaware, New York, Ohio, Maryland, and Colorado. Among the buyers was Pennsylvania Governor George M. Leader, who has started Angus operations in York County. He purchased the lot 52 cow, Queen 16th of W-C, consigned by Walling-Crest Farm, Washington, Pa., for \$290. Calved Sept. 28, 1954, she was a senior yearling granddaughter of the \$10,000 LeBaron DeLux.

Pennsylvania's State Secretary of Agriculture, Dr. William L. Henning, was both a consignor and buyer in the sale. He entered two female lots, and purchased the lot 40 cow, the Nov. 26, 1954 Pridemere Lady PS, consigned by Pennsylvania State University, University Park, Pa., for \$380. She was a daughter of Ankonian 3502d, out of Ravenscroft Ellen B. W., selling with breeding privileges to O. Bardoliermere 32d, supreme champion at the 1954 Aberdeen Angus Futurity.

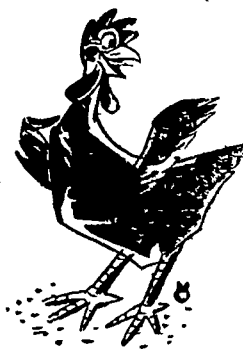
