

Outlook for Mid-May to Mid-June 1956



The Weather Bureau's 30-day outlook for the period from mid-May to mid-June calls for temperatures to average above seasonal normals in the southeastern quarter of the nation and in the West Coast States. Below normal temperatures are predicted over the Great Lakes, Northeast, Northern Plains, and Central Pla-



teau. In other areas mean temperatures should be near normal.

Rainfall is expected to exceed normal in the Missouri and Mississippi Valleys and the Great Lakes Region. Subnormal amounts are indicated west of the Continental Divide and in the Southeast, and near normal elsewhere.


