SAUSAGE STUFFED MUSHROOMS

One-half pound sausage meat
Two teaspoons grated onion
One-fourth cup bread crumbs
One-half teaspoon salt
One-eighth teaspoon pepper
12-18 large fresh mushrooms
Mix sausage, onion, crumbs, salt and pepper. Wash mushrooms, dry and remove stems. Chop stems finely and stir into sausage mixture. Form into balls and place in mushroom caps. Arrange mushrooms in baking dish and bake at 350 degrees F 20 minutes, basting once. Four servings.

Cooked pork sausage links are used for the sausage-stuffed green pepper rings and the skewered sausage chunks with pineapple.

To prepare the links so they will be plump, juicy, well browned, and thoroughly cooked, follow these directions: Place links in a cold skillet. Do not prick the skins. Add three tablespoons water, cover, and cook five minutes. Uncover and drain off any water. Cook links over low heat, turning often until well browned.

SAUSAGE LINKS IN GREEN PEPPER RINGS

Pan-fry green pepper rings in sausage drippings 3 to 4 minutes. Arrange two or three cooked pork sausage links in each ring, serve immediately.

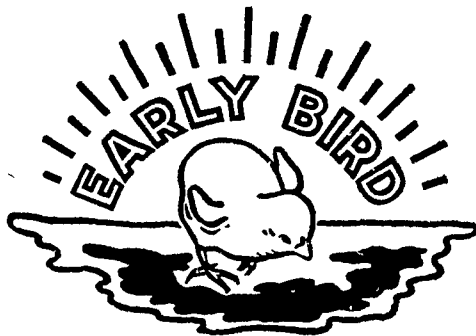
