## Holstein Friesian Convention Will Open Wednesday

Dairy Month in America's Dairyland will get off to a spectacular start when more than 2,000 of the nation's top dairymen get together at Milwaukee, Wis., June 6 and 7 for the 71st Annual Convention of The Holstein-Friesian Association of America.

Key figures in the proceedings will be 176 official delegates — elected representatives of a total membership of more than 46,000 — who will formulate the policies and elect the officers of the world's largest dairy cattle registry organiza-

tion. New York, generally regarded as the American "cradle of the Holsteins" will have the largest representation with 25 delegates.
