BACON AND POTATO BAKE

Four large potatoes, pared
Three onions, sliced
One-third cup flour
One tablespoon salt
One-fourth teaspoon pepper
One teaspoon celery salt
One-half pound bacon
Water

Cut potatoes in quarters. Sprinkle with flour and seasonings. Add water to half the depth of the vegetables. Arrange slices of bacon on top. Cover with lid or pie plate, and bake in 400-degree oven 30 minutes. Uncover and continue baking for 20 minutes more.

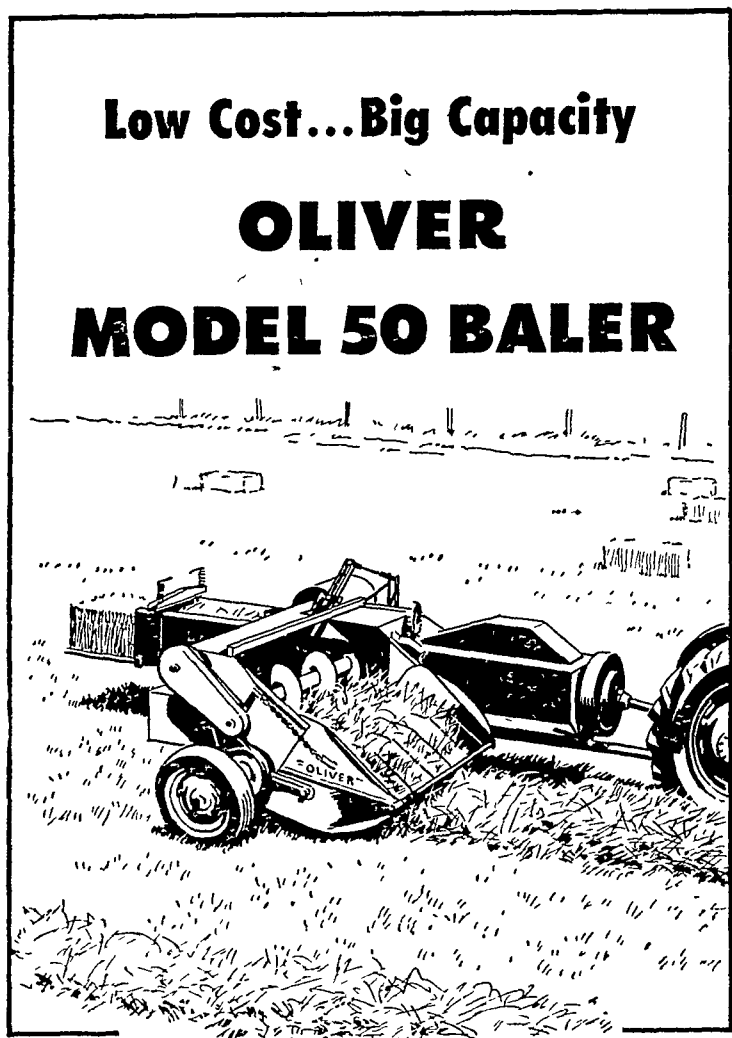

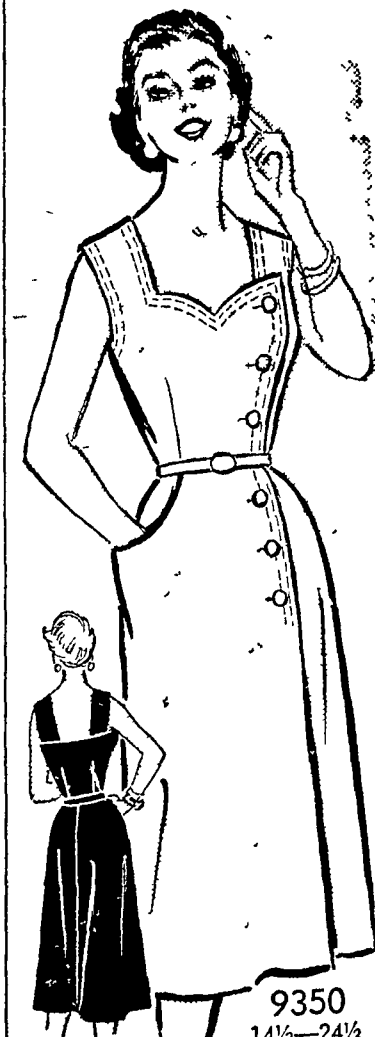
