Cattle Trade in Chicago Good; Receipts Heavy

Despite heavy receipts, marked improvement in the cattle market at Chicago was reported this week, due to a little better action in dressed meat, at eastern consuming centers.

Receipts Monday and Tuesday of this week, preceding the Memorial Day holiday, were 30,000 for the two days. Fed steers in that time advanced 25 to 50 cents, heifers were 25 to 75 cents higher, with the bulk choice steers selling from \$20.50 to \$21.25.

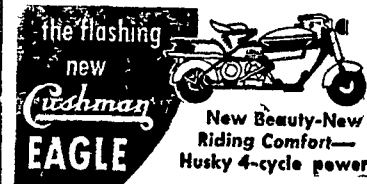
A few lots prime Monday topped in Chicago at \$24.50, but by

Tuesday the top was but \$24.25 on some 1150-pounders. By late Tuesday good clearance of the 30,000 was reported.

Receipts of hogs remain good, with prices lower on a Chicago two-day run of 144,000. For the corresponding days last week, only 130,000 were received. Prices were 25 cents or more lower, with the bulk \$17.25 to \$17.65, a few at \$18.00.
