

Prices Go Lower In Tuesday Sale Of Broilers Here

Lancaster Poultry Exchange (Rohrerstown, Pa.) (Sales Report, Sale 152, Tuesday, June 5, 1956) — Sharp declines were marked in the Tuesday sale of 43,800 broilers in 14 lots at the Lancaster Poultry Exchange, with a final tally showing a drop to an average of 1971 from a range of 19 to 20½ cents. Nineteen lots totaling 58,100 birds were offered. Thursday's average was 21.03.

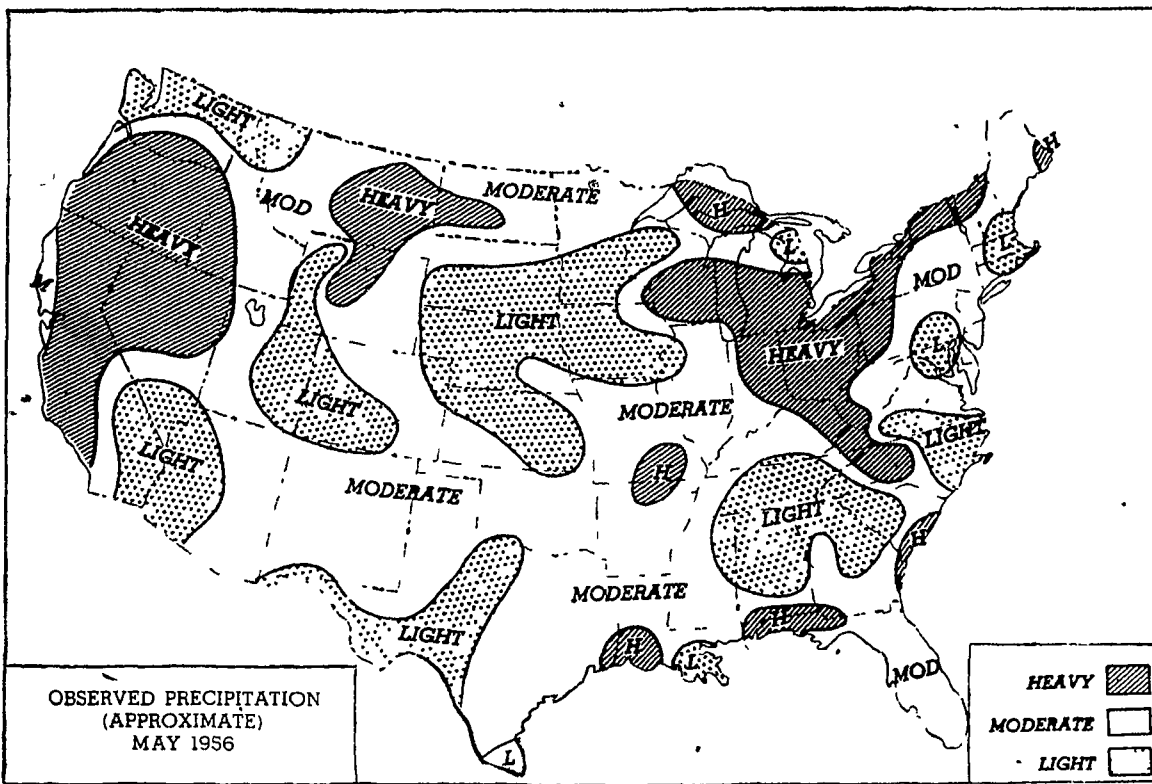
Heavier marketings are said responsible for part of the decline. Last month 679,045 birds were auctioned, or 178,950 more than the corresponding month last year. Prices in May 1955 ranged from 26.4 to 28.5, in May 1956 from 20 to 21.5.

For the corresponding day a year ago, Tuesday, June 7, 1955, sale 60, 14 lots totaling 47,090 birds were offered and sold in a range of 26¼ to 28½, averaging 28.
