## For Farm Women . . .

Pork often is served with fruit — and the tart flavor of the fruit is a nice contrast to the sweetness of the meat. In this recipe, diced apples are added to a bread stuffing for pork steaks. This well seasoned dressing also can be served with pork chops or a fresh shoulder roast.

### PORK STEAKS WITH APPLE STUFFING

- Four pork shoulder steaks
- Two slices bacon
- One-half cup chopped celery
- One-half cup chopped onion
- Three tart apples, chopped
- One-third cup sugar
- Two cups packaged bread stuffing
- One-fourth cup chopped parsley
- One-fourth cup milk

Brown steaks on both sides in a little hot fat and season with salt and pepper. Meanwhile, dice bacon and pan-fry until crisp. Remove bacon and drain on absorbent paper. Cook celery and onion in remaining fat 3 minutes. Add apples to celery mixture and sprinkle with sugar. Cover and cook slowly until tender. Add crumbled bacon, stuffing, parsley, and milk, and

### CAN FRESH FRUITS IN WATER BATH CONTAINER

To help with the food bill this year, can fresh fruits, Helen L. Denning, extension nutritionist of the Pennsylvania State University advises.

Any flat-bottomed, clean vessel of sufficient depth with a tight-fitting lid may be used for a boiling water bath canner.

Depth of the vessel should be at least eight inches for pint jars and 10 inches for quart jars so the water will come one inch or more over the tops of the jars.

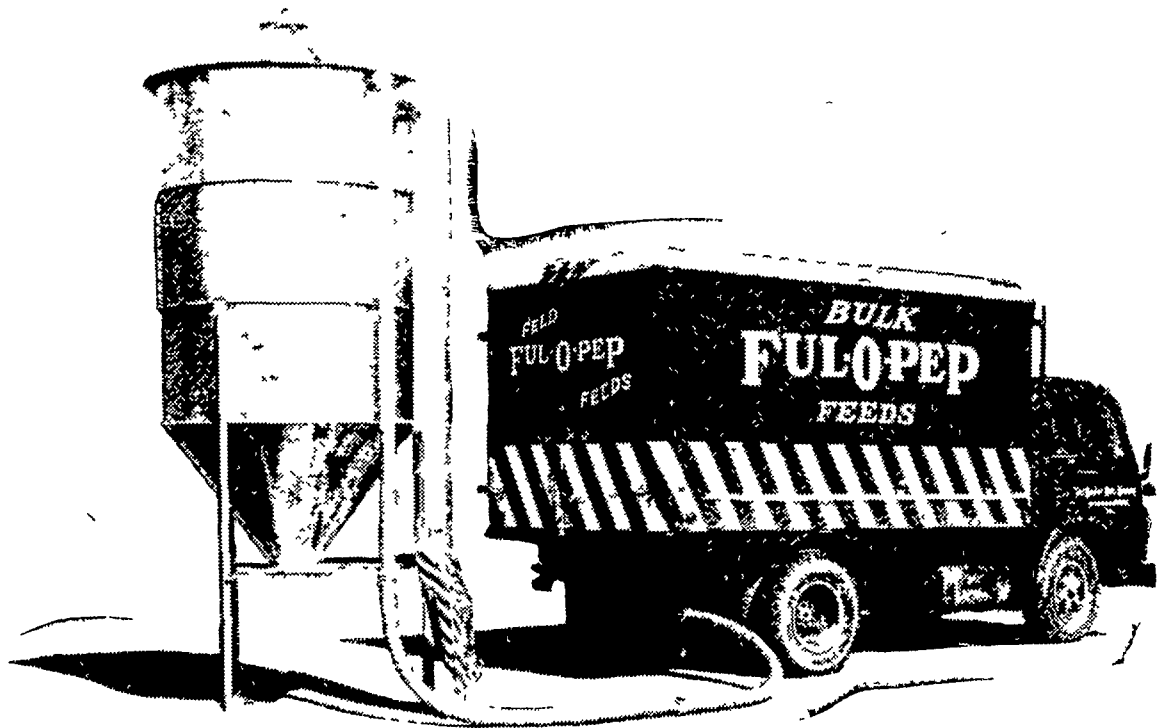
