

Broilers Thursday Lose Half Cent In Lancaster Trade; Average 19.60

Lancaster Poultry Exchange (Rohrerstown, Pa., Sales Report, sale 153, Thursday, June 7, 1956) — Continued heavy receipts pushed the market on broilers a half cent lower at the Lancaster Poultry Exchange Thursday. Listed were 51 lots, 157,395 birds; offered, 52 lots, 149,480 birds, sold, 41 lots, 123,255 birds, not sold, 11 lots, 26,225 birds, withdrawn, 10,115 birds.

Prices ranged from 18 1-2 to 20 1-4, with 40 lots of broilers totaling 122,550 birds averaging 19.60. One lot of heavy fowl brought 25 cents, and one lot of capettes 26 3-4 cents.

For the week, a total of 206,380 birds were received, a near record figure.

Topping the Thursday market was Elam Kauffman, R2, Conestoga with 500 White Cross broilers, sold by Miller & Bushong, 10 wks, two days, selling to Roy E Ream at 20 1-2.
