Q My husband and I have been separated over 12 years and I do not know where he is I have tried to get in touch with him for over five year I have insurance on him and wish to cash it in. but they say he has to sign it over to me I have paid it for 20 years myself Is there any way I can get this money?

A If you are the owner of your insurance policy, you should be able to obtain its cash surrender value without the signature of your husband. That is a matter to be taken up with your insurance company. If you are not the owner, there is a proceeding by which your husband may be declared presumed dead after an absence of seven years. This action must be instituted in the county where he was last a resident

Q How do we go about collecting an account of long standing? The total amount of the bill is \$167.85 for violin lessons which my husband gave to two girls between September, 195 and June, 1955. We have credited the father with a total of \$110, leaving a balance due of \$57.85. Bills for this amount have been rendered monthly.

On the last bill which I sent in August this year, I threatened to place same in the hands of a collector if not taken care of by Sept 15. To date we have heard nothing from him and we are badly in need of this money.

A. Suit for this balance can be instituted before a justice of the peace You can institute this suit personally or through an attorney It may be best for you to consult an attorney who may be able to collect this for you by writing a letter

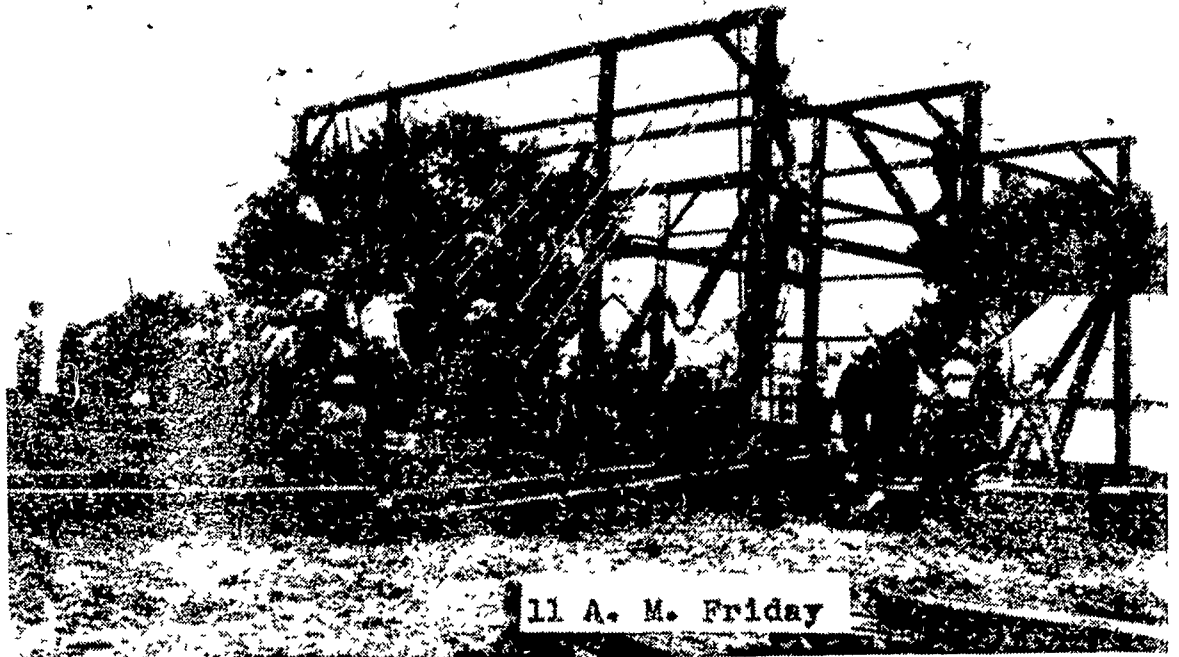
A No You are not responsible for money borrowed by your son from a bank as long as he borrowed on his own responsibility.

Next meeting, July 21, will feature the Migrant Workers Committee. A dairy supper was held prior to the business meeting.

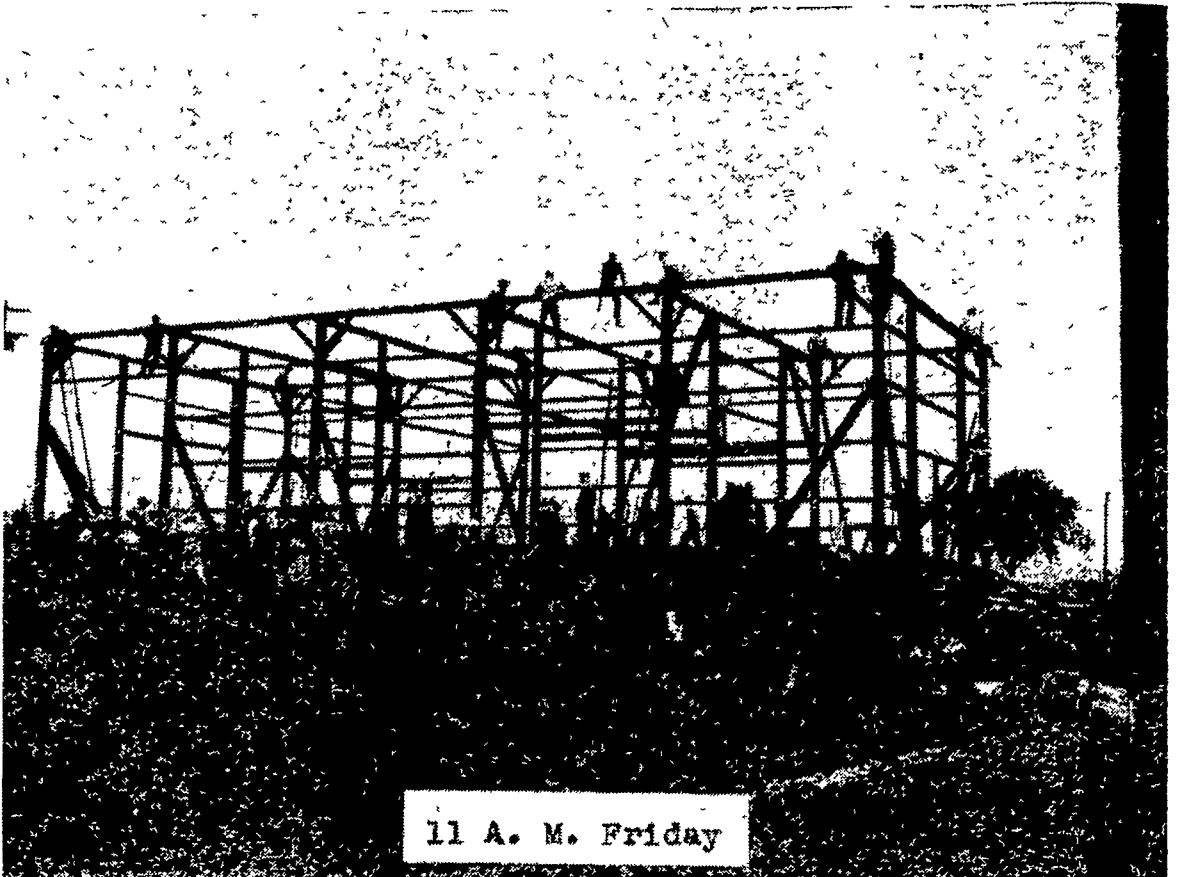

Pike Poles A-Resting

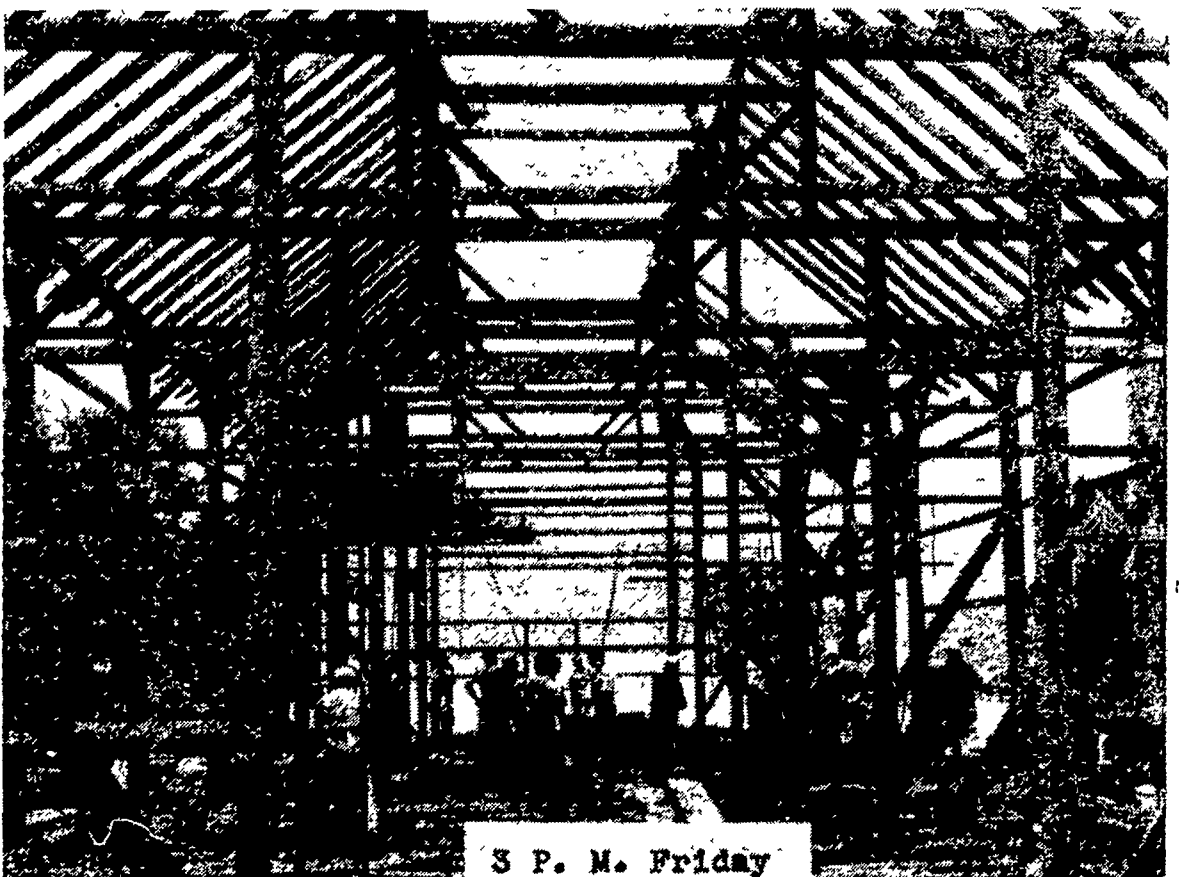
