Tuesday Broiler Auction Declines Cent, Avg. 21.68

Lancaster Poultry Exchange (Rohrerstown, Pa.) (Sales Report, Sale 163. Tuesday, July 17, 1956) — Prices moved more than a cent lower here Tuesday in the sale of 47,950 broilers in 13 lots. Not sold were 1200

birds. Fifteen lots totaling 49,700 birds were listed and 14 lots, 49,150 were offered.

Ten lots — 45,900 broilers — sold from 21½ to 22, averaging 21.68 cents. Three lots — 2,050 Leghorn fowl — sold at 17 and 17½ cents.

More than 153,000 birds were listed for yesterday's sale. For the corresponding day a year ago, Tuesday, July 19, 1955, sale 71, nine lots, 17,100 birds, were offered and sold in a range of 28 to 29 cents, averaging 28.58.

Philadelphia July 18 (USDA) — Market unsettled. Supplies of most classes were more than adequate for the fair but very selective demand. Large cross pullets 30 cents, white rocks 28 cents, few lots higher. Large white rock caponettes 25-28 cents, small sizes 23-25 cents, crosses 22 cents, roasters 20-25 cents without clearing. Cross fryers 23-26 cents, white rocks 24 cents, turkeys about steady. Demand fair for light supplies. Bronze young hens 37-40 cents. Bronze breeders 20-22 cents without clearing.

Receipts July 17 included Delaware 11,000 lbs, Maryland 10,000 lbs.
