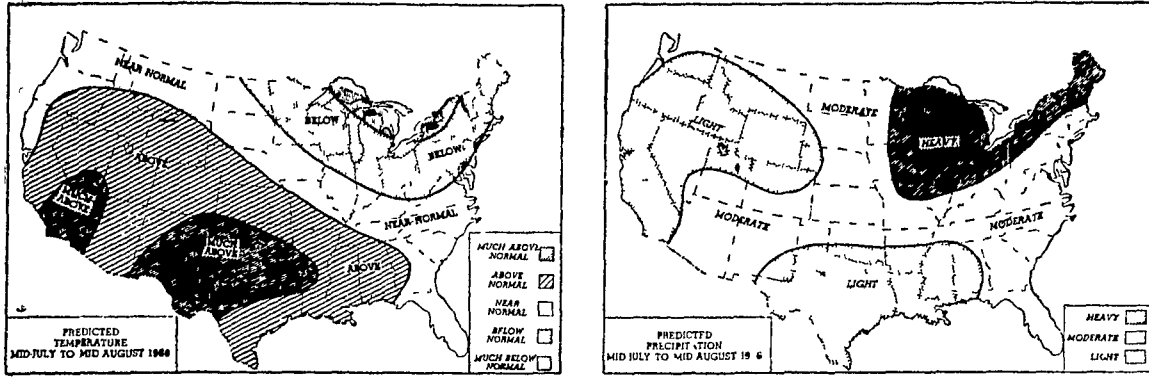


Outlook for Mid-July to Mid-August, 1956



The Weather Bureau's 30-day outlook borders and in the South Atlantic States. Precipitation is expected to exceed normal in the Great Lakes region and Mid-west. Subnormal amounts are indicated in the Northeast West. In the West Gulf States, the Far West, and the Northern Rocky Mountain States Elsewhere temperatures are predicted except near where near normal precipitation is anticipated along the northern and western part.

er dominated by frequent showers. Field work was retarded with harvest of wheat and hay practically at a standstill.

Continued wet weather may cause further lodging of wheat and possibilities of grain sprouting in the shocks are great, the survey report showed.

Some barley and winter oats remain to be harvested. Corn and other crops are growing well but need warmer nights for best development. As a result of poor curing weather much hay remains to be cut in northern counties. Poor quality of hay is anticipated due to over maturity. Pastures are good to excellent in most areas. "Topping" of tobacco is about to start in early planted fields.

In southern Pennsylvania counties the picking of red

cherries is past peak, apples and peaches are sizing well, picking of Transparent and Lodi apples has started and early peaches are coloring but need more sunshine.

Tomato harvest is late but movement has started as far north as Luzerne County where very light supplies from staked acreage in that area made their appearance in local markets. Snap beans are moving to processors in limited volume.

Broiler Prices Decline; 20.8 Average Tuesday

Lancaster Poultry Exchange (Rohreistown, Pa.), (Sales Report, Sale 165, Tuesday, July 24, 1956) — Fractional declines again marked the Tuesday, July 24 auction of 18,855 broilers in a market that averaged 20.84 on broilers, with two lots totaling 11,880 birds unsold. Listed and offered were 11 lots, 30,655, but when bidding stopped at 21 cents, the two lots were withdrawn.

Broilers ranged from 20 1/4 to 22 1/2 cents, and one lot of 800 heavy fowl sold at 20 1/2. One lot of 175 pullets brought 28 1/2 cents. Donald Groff, R1 Manheim, topped Tuesday market with 600 White Vantress that sold to John Rettinger, Halifax, at 22 1/2.

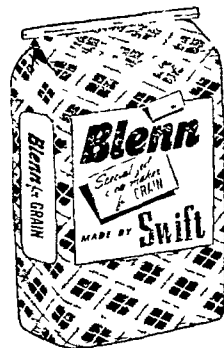
