

## Broilers Gain Quarter Cent Thursday Top 21.5 on Broilers, Average 21.16

Lancaster Poultry Exchange (Rohreistown, Pa.) (Sales Report, Sale 166, Thursday July 26, 1956) — Prices advanced fractionally Thursday in the sale of 52 lots of 150,340 birds on the Lancaster Poultry Exchange, ranging from 20 1/4 to 21 1/2 on 48 lots totaling 148,090 broilers, averaging 21.16. Three lots, 1,950 Leghorn fowl, sold at 16 1/2, 16 1/2 and 17 cents, and one lot of 300 heavy fowl sold at 21 1/2.

For the week ending July 26, 66 lots totaling 193,295 birds were listed and 61 lots, 169,195 birds were sold. For the corresponding week a year ago, in 1955, listed were 56 lots, 181,770 birds, sold were 49 lots, 159,570 birds, in a range of 28 1/2 to 31 cents, averaging 29.65.

Topping Thursday's sale was I. Jacob Breneman, R6 Lancaster, who sold 465 Red Vantress, 12 weeks, 5 days, to Daniel Good, R1 Columbia, at 21 1/2.

## Lancaster Livestock: \$27 Cattle Top Best of Season; Best Hogs Score \$19

LANCASTER, Aug. 1 — (USDA) — (Wednesday to Wednesday Review) CATTLE This week 4.604, week ago 4.087. Compared with last Wednesday fed steers mostly 50-75c higher, heifers around 50 cents higher. Cows 25-50 lower, bull steady to 75 cents lower, most decline on cutter and utility grade bulls. Good stock steers about steady, common and medium around 50 cents lower. Fleshy feeding steers 800 lbs and up strong to 50 cents or more higher. Trading was moderately active early this week on moderate offering of fed steers. Heifers in very small supply. Around 45 per cent of the run was stocker and feeder steers and 10 to 15 per cent was cows. Stockers and feeds were mainly common to good grades. Bulk choice and prime fed steers \$24.00-26.00, several loads 1100-1300 lbs \$26.50, one load \$26.75 and one load prime 1185 lb steers \$27.00, highest of the current season. Good and low choice steers \$21.50-23.50 with some standard grades \$19.50-21.00. A few standard to good heifers \$17.00-20.50, small lot high choice to prime 990 lb heifers \$23.00. Utility and commercial cows after Monday \$12.00-14.00; most canners and cutters \$9.00-12.00, high yielding cutters to \$13.00. Utility and commercial bulls \$15.00-17.00, weighty commercials to \$18.00 early and 800-1,050 lb fed bulls early as high as \$21.00. Cutter grade bulls \$13.00-14.50, some lightweights down to \$12.00. Bulk medium and good 425-750 lb stock steers \$17.50-20.00, a few loads and lots 750-950 lb good feeder steers \$19.00-20.50. Numerous lots and loads common stock steers \$14.00-16.50, some down to \$12.50.

CALVES. This week 723, week ago 779. Compared with last Wednesday, prices mostly steady. Bulk good and choice veal calves \$20.00-23.50, small showing high choice and prime \$24.00-28.00, a few head Monday to \$29.00. Util-

ity and commercial grades \$15.00-19.00 and culls down to \$11.00

HOGS This week 1,452, week ago 1,665. Bulk of the run barrows and gilts U S mixed 1-3, 180-240 lb weights. Sows scarce each day. Compared with last Wednesday barrows and gilts steady to strong. Bulk barrows and gilts U S mixed 1-3, 180-240 lbs \$18.00-18.50, around 100 head mostly No. 1, on Monday at \$19.00. A few scattered lots both 240-270 and 160-180 lbs \$17.00-18.00. Sows all weights \$11.50-14.00.

SHEEP 536, week ago 308. Spring lambs mostly steady with last Wednesday. Trading moderately active to slow. Bulk good and choice spring lambs \$18.50-23.00, a few odd lots high choice and prime \$23.50-25.00. Utility down to \$16.00 and culls as low as \$12.00.
