

Engineers' Group Plans Exhibit Of Steam Threshers

The eighth annual reunion of the Rough and Tumble Engineers Historical Association will be held on Aug. 16, 17 and 18 at the Young Company, Kinzer, on U S Rt. 30 in Lancaster County.

A feature of this reunion will be a large display of steam engines, many of them still in operation, which were used extensively for threshing and sawmilling many years ago.

Threshing contests will be held during the three-day affair, as well as a hobby show.

A memorial service will be held on Saturday, Aug 18, at 10 a m for the late Arthur S. Young, Kinzer, who formed the association.

The association has been incorporated and plans are underway to erect a building for the permanent display of the old steam engines.

Officers state that this will be a living memorial to the late Mr. Young.

Dallas Trucker Wins July State Safety Award

HARRISBURG — Eighteen years of safe truck driving and 1,150,000 accident-free miles have today won W. Frank Gosart of Dallas, Pa, the Pennsylvania Motor Truck Association's Driver of the July Month Award and a personal "thank you" from Governor George Leader.

In a ceremony in the Governor's office, Gosart was awarded a gold lapel pin and the PMTA citation attesting his driving ability and safety record. Governor Leader thanked Gosart for his personal contribution to safer highway operations and lauded him as a good citizen. Both Gosart and his wife received watches from Mushroom Transportation Company of Philadelphia, Gosart's employer.

Gosart accounted for 850,000 miles of his record during the past 14 years as an employee of the Mushroom Transportation Company. During this period he drove a tractor semi-trailer in over-the-road service between Williamsport, Pennsylvania and Buffalo, New York with no accidents. Previous to this, Gosart was employed for four years by M & G Convoy, driving a car carrier out of Buffalo and added 300,000 more safe miles to his record.
