Prices Lower During Tuesday Broiler Sale

Lancaster Poultry Exchange (Rohrerstown, Pa.) (Sales Report, sale 169, Tuesday, Aug. 7, 1956)—With reduced Tuesday receipts, prices moved a fraction lower on the sale of 20,850 birds in five lots at the Lancaster Poultry Exchange Tuesday Four lots, 19,850 broilers, sold from 20¼ to 20½, averaging 20.49 cents, and one lot, 1,000 fowl, sold at 19%. Average on broilers was 20.49. Eleven lots, 32,950 birds were listed and offered, leaving 12,000 unsold.

For the corresponding sale a year ago, Tuesday, Aug 9, 1955, sale 76, listed, offered and sold were nine lots, 11,925 birds at prices of 27 to 29½, averaging 28.06 cents
