J. Elvin Hess Holstein Wins Garden Spot

Keen competition between exhibitors paralleled eager interest among spectators at the Annual Cattle Show sponsored by the Southeastern Penna. Artificial Breeding Cooperative Thursday, Aug 2, on the grounds of the Cooperative. A record number of 232 animals were paraded by 103 exhibitors vying for blue ribbons and top money.

Concurrent with the new high set in the number of exhibitors and animals was a new high of 1,350 spectators attending the show. An unusually high percentage of these people took this opportunity to tour the laboratories and offices of the headquarters. Particular interest was shown in the new IBM punch-card system recently set up in the SPABC office to more efficiently handle the records of the more than 14,000 members of the Cooperative.

Ocker Ayrshires Win

Both top honors in the Ayrshire Breed were taken by John E. Ocker of Shippensburg, Pa., who paraded Bellboy's Nancy's Ann to the judge's fancy winning Senior and Grand Champion and Major Rosalie to win Junior Champion.

Loy N. Oindorf of Littlestown won Senior and Grand Champion Brown Swiss honors with Loyetta a three-year-old cow. Ritterlea Genesis Becky Lea won Junior Champion for Ritter Brothers of Carlisle, Pa.

Senior and Grand Champion Guernsey honors were won by Daniel Harris' Penn Manor Farm of Newark, Del., with seven-year-old Berkley Lady Gloria Ulster Alexander's Delight, a proud Junior Yearling strutted to the judge's liking to win Junior Champion of the Guernsey Breed.

72 Junior Heifers

Real competition loomed up before the judge among the 72 heifers in the Junior division of the Holstein Breed. However, Junior Champion honors were snagged by Marilyn Rae Newlin of Grantville with her Senior Yearling, Newburn Admiral Lucille. Official Judges of the show were John Morse of the University of Maryland and Paul Misner of Newtown, Pa. Both men are known internationally for their judging abilities.

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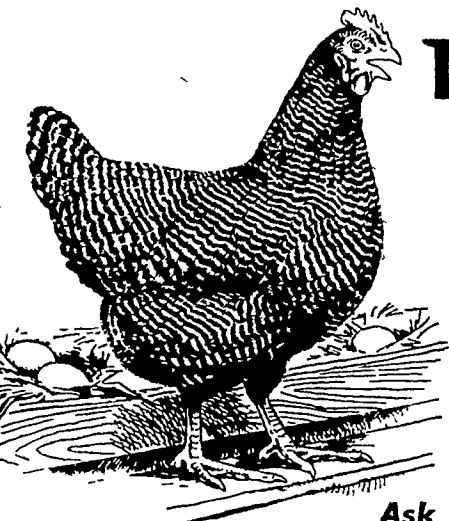
For June 1st, the prices of farm products had jumped eight percent in the last five months, recovered to the levels of a year ago. A three per cent increase between mid-April and

To make tall, narrow windows look wider, use extension rods which allow draperies to hang out on the wall, Doris L. Snook, Penn State extension home management specialist, suggests.

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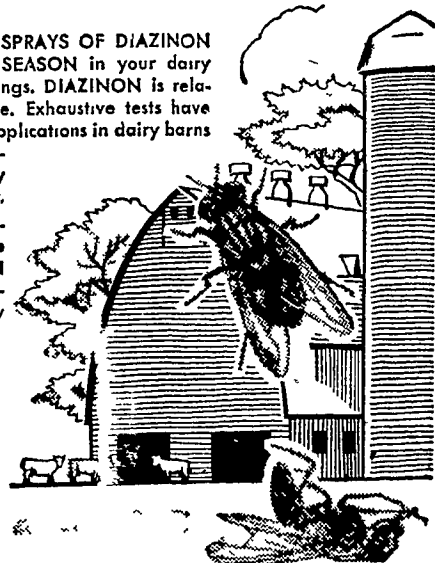
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
