Heads State Cancer Drive

The Pennsylvania Division of the American Cancer Society has received more than \$1,532,000 from citizens of the Commonwealth who contributed to the 1956 Cancer Crusade, it was announced today by Fred Waring, state campaign chairman.

This amount is \$100,000 greater than the \$1,432,000 contributed in the 1955 Cancer Crusade, reported Mr. Waring.

Some Returns Incomplete
Mr. Waring said that while the campaign is completed in most sections of the state, there are still a few county units whose final returns are incomplete, and the total subscription to the 1956 Crusade is expected to show an increase by the end of the Society's fiscal year, August 31.

More than \$900,000 of the current campaign funds will be used by county units and the Pennsylvania Division for their programs of service and education. The remaining sum will be allocated for cancer research throughout the United States and for national projects to develop educational aids for both professional and lay persons. A share of the nation-wide research program is active in Pennsylvania institutions where the national program is supporting cancer research with grants amounting to approximately half a million dollars.
