

Flying Farmers Crown '56 Queen

deep in mud on the ground during the morning. Nevertheless, thousands crowded the edges of the air strip, alongside the grounds for the arrival of Queen Florence by helicopter, coronation ceremonies, helicopter demonstrations, flying contests, spraying demonstrations, and exhibitions of latest model aircraft.

Among those attending the new Queen were Miss Joyce Huber, four-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. David Huber of Peach Bottom, near Little Britain Church, her mother, Mrs. Charlotte Adeline Huber, and the retiring queen, Mrs. L. L. (Lois) Logan of Kennett Square. Little Miss Huber was crown-bearer.

Others in the court were Mrs. Robert (Helen) Jackson of R1 New Galilee, Miss Janice Kathryn Kimmel, daughter of the Queen, of Enon Valley, Mrs. Nedra (Bill) Richey of Petersburg, Ohio, and Miss Judith Ann Pisor, 15, daughter of the state president, Russ Pisor of Portersville.

Business sessions of the state Flying Farmers were concluded before lunch, to give the full afternoon for the ceremonies and demonstrations. Five directorships were filled, with Dave Huber of Peach Bottom among the outgoing directors. Elected were Elmo Travis of Smicksburg; Russell Pisor of Portersville, for a one-year term; Gail Kimmel of Enon Valley; Bob Jackson; and Elwood Homan of Pennsylvania Furnace.

Mr. Kimmel was named official Pennsylvania delegate to the National Flying Farmers Association convention in New Orleans, which was concluded yesterday. Eight members indicated they and their families would represent the Keystone State at New Orleans. Others, especially in the western part of the state, report adverse farming conditions — too much moisture — demanded that they remain home to harvest small grain from the mud.

Two international guests were in attendance, Zarrar Khan of Sadikabad, West Pakistan, an International Faim Youth Exchange guest of Mr. and Mrs. Jackson, and Rolf Egh, from Ostermundigen, a suburb of Bern, Switzerland, a guest of the Logans, who is at Kennett Square under the sponsorship of the Ford Foundation and the Kennett Square Rotary Club.

A line of lime was spread across the landing strip for spot landing contests. Uneven terrain and tricky atmospheric conditions made both this and the bomb dropping contests especially tough. However, Gail Kimmel placed first in spot landings, and Bill Richey second.

In the bombing contest, where a paper sack of lime was dropped from an altitude of about 200 feet, aimed at a cross mark on the lime strip, Russ Pisor placed first, Bill Richey second.

Attendance at the Butler Show was excellent, despite weather that made a swamp of many tents Thursday night. By mid-afternoon grounds had dried sufficiently to permit easy access to all exhibits. In the junior daisy show Friday morning, 101 entrants were in competition. Thursday's Cavalcade of Livestock was postponed until Friday night due to the late afternoon rainstorm.

Thursday Pennsylvania Flying Farmers hosted Four-H and Future Farmer of America exhibitors in plane flights over the Butler Farm Show Grounds and over the city. Some 65 youths were treated by the Pennsylvania "pasture pilots."

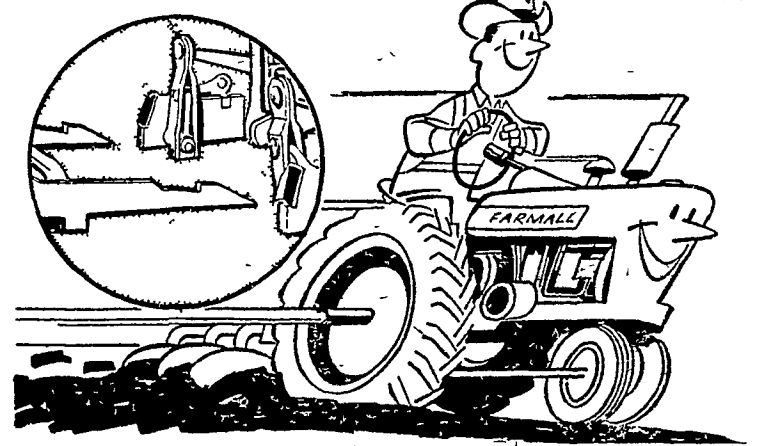

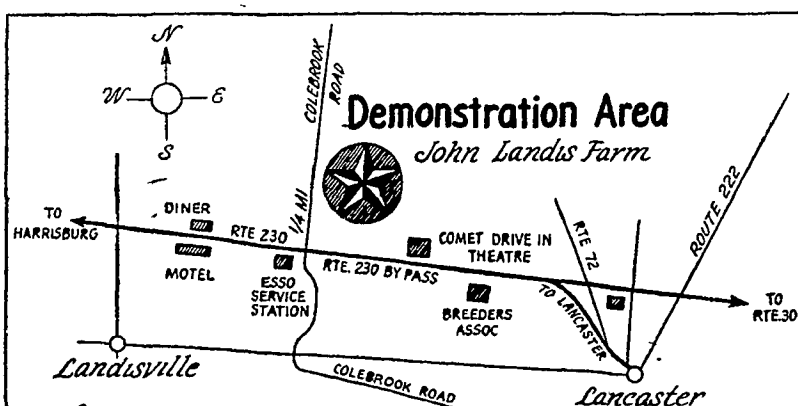
