

Broilers Thursday Strengthen Only Fractionally; Still Below 20 Cents

Lancaster Poultry Exchange (Rohrerstown, Pa.) (Sales Report, Sale 172, Thursday, Aug. 16, 1956) — Broilers Thursday of last week averaged 19.29 cents on the Lancaster Poultry Exchange, a slight gain from the 19.20 cents of the previous Tuesday. Listed were 39 lots, 112,000 birds, offered were 112,600 in 38 lots, and sold were 35 lots, 110,450 birds.

Thirty-three lots, 108,000 broilers sold in a range of 19 to 21, averaging 19.29, one lot of 1150 Leghorn fowl made 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ and one lot of 500 heavy pullets made 25 $\frac{1}{2}$.

For the week, which includes sales Tuesday, Aug. 14 and Thursday, Aug. 16, 1956, a total of 46 lots, 131,050

birds were listed, 45 lots, 131,650 offered and 40 lots, 118,100, were sold. For the corresponding week a year ago, 59 lots of 140,675 birds were offered, and 53 lots, 138,015 sold. In sale 78, Aug. 18, 1955, prices ranged from 27 to 32 $\frac{1}{2}$, averaging 29.05.

Walter C. Mellinger, Bird-in-Hand, paid the Thursday top last week, 21 cents on 475 Indian River capettes, 10 weeks, offered by Irvin W. Weaver, R5 Lancaster.

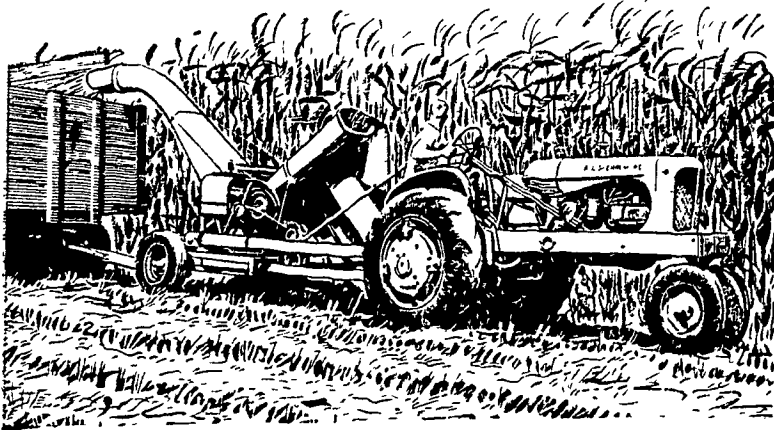
