

## Income Tax in Poultry Trade Will Be Aired

Food sales reached a new high in first half of year.

TRENTON, N. J.—Tax-pinch-ed poultrymen will have their problems scanned by one of the nation's top income tax critics at the NEPPCO Exposition in Syracuse, N. Y., Oct. 2-4.

T. Coleman Andrews, former U. S. Commissioner of Internal Revenue and an outspoken critic of U. S. income tax laws, will be the featured speaker during the second day of the exposition, sponsored by the Northeastern Poultry Producers Council, in the War Memorial Building. His scathing denunciations of our tax structure have made him a top attraction as a speaker, and the subject of numerous articles in some of the nation's finest slick-paper publications.

Andrews has charged — and proved — that income taxation was conceived upon a 'soak the rich' philosophy that has gone unchanged in better than 40 years. Taxes are too complicated, Andrews believes, and they unfairly penalize the folks who are most productive and capable.

Andrews is only one of the top speakers who will take part in "NEPPCO's World Series of the Poultry Industry." According to Dr. Alfred Van Wageningen, NEPPCO managing director, the speaking line-up will include such topics as a knock-down, drag-out "rhubarb" on the merits of inbred chickens versus purebreds, cage layer housing and management, vertical integration and the causes behind vaccination breaks.

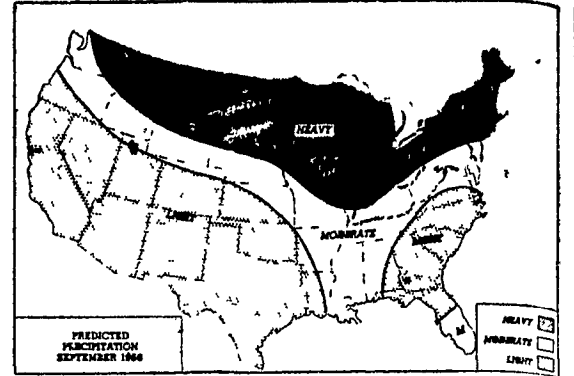
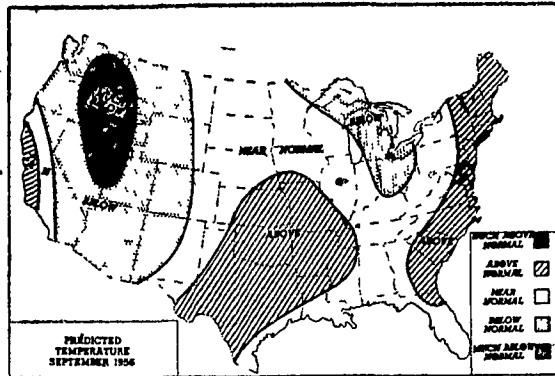

The Weather Bureau's 30-day outlook for September 1956 calls for temperatures to average below seasonal normals west of the Continental Divide and in the Great Lakes region. Above normal temperatures are predicted for the East Coast and Southern Plains, with near nor-

mal elsewhere.

Precipitation is expected to exceed normal in most of the northern third of the nation. Subnormal amounts are indicated in the southwestern quarter of the country and in the South Atlantic States. Elsewhere near normal rainfall is anticipated.

## Two Miles of Chicken Served At Dutch Days

HARRISBURG, Pa. — Placed end to end there was two miles of chicken served to the 100,000 people that attended the Poultry Festival and the Dutch Days celebration at Hershey, Pa. on Aug. 23, 24, 25 and 26, sponsored by the Pennsylvania State Poultry Federation and the Dutch Days Committee. For those hungry people who did not eat chicken there was available, one ton of ground cooked turkey made into delicious turkeyburgers and Turkey (white meat) sandwiches; 200 gallons of chicken corn soup, 10,000 servings of egg nog and 3,000 pickled eggs.

This Poultry Festival and Dutch Days celebration was attended by at least 200,000 people, mostly of city origin and is the largest Poultry Festival within the United States, as reported by Homer J. Bickler, Chairman of the Poultry Festival.

Mr. Walter S Shearer, Chairman of the Program and Publicity Committee reports that before an audience of 7,000 people, the guest speaker, The Honorable Ezra Taft Benson, U. S. Secretary of Agriculture, offered great praise to the poultry industry for trying to solve their own problems without the aid of Government.

Included in the party to meet Secretary and Mrs Benson were Pennsylvanias' Secretary of Agriculture, Dr William L Henning, the former Secretary of Agriculture and at present a aide to Secretary Benson, Miles Horst; as well as Robert D. McMillen, Assistant to Secretary Benson.

Other features of the Poultry Festival were the Poultry Queen and Chicken Cooking Contests. The Poultrymen were proud to present the contestants as they identified themselves as being "products" of our homes and our farms, of which they were proud; as Pennsylvania is a state which is noted for its fine cooks and pretty girls. Mrs. Ezra Taft Benson crowned the new Queen, Miss Elizabeth Erb of Lebanon and the new Cooking Champion, Mrs. Edna Sands of Tunkhannock, Pa.

The Pennsylvania State Poultry Federation was responsible for the entire gala Poultry Festival, as it is responsible for many other activities of the poultrymen throughout our great Commonwealth.
