Robert O. Whitmore, president of the New Holland Farmers Day Association, announced this week that the premium list for the Farmers Fair is more complete and offers better prize money than ever before.

The 25th Anniversary of the Farmers Fair will be observed on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, Oct. 3, 4, 5, and 6. The Association will exceed its high previous prize record this year.

Last year \$1313.25 was paid in premiums and this year the list has been expanded. All persons within a radius of 20 miles of New Holland are eligible to enter exhibits.

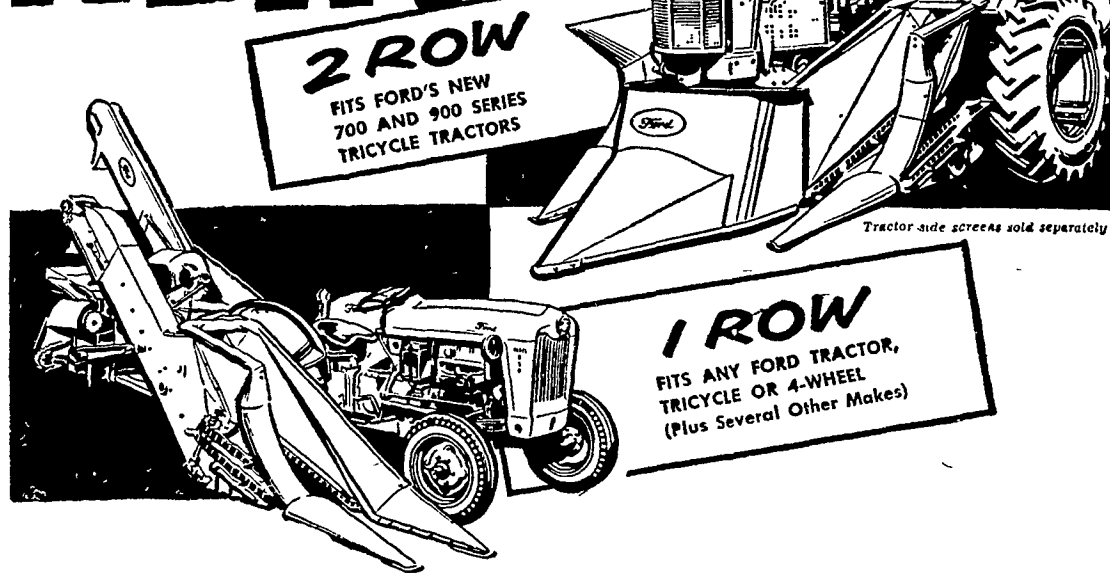
