Mussers Second, Greiders Fourth In Egg Contest

HARRISBURG — Top place and a prize of \$100 goes to George M. Anthony, Strausstown, Berks County, for highest quality eggs produced in the 1955-56 Pennsylvania Official Egg Laying Test the State Department of Agriculture announced Friday.

Eggs produced by one of the White Leghorn hens entered in the laying test by Anthony scored 99.52 out of a possible 100 points on a quality rating, according to L. H. Bull, State Deputy Secretary of Agriculture.

An Anthony White Leghorn hen finished second in last year's Pennsylvania egg quality test. This year he had a second hen that finished 10th.

Cash prizes in the egg quality test total \$330 provided for the second year by the Acme Super Markets owned by the American Stores Company.

Second place and \$50 is awarded to the Musser Leghorn Farm, Mt. Joy, Pa., with 99.45 points. Third place and \$50 goes to Blanton Smith's Chicks, Nashville, Tenn., 99.41 points.

Owner of last year's top quality pen, Greider Leghorn Farm, also of Mt. Joy, finished fourth in this year's quality test with a score of 99.38 points, receiving \$25.

Other placings: Colonial Poultry Farm, Pleasant Hill, Mo., fifth with 99.21 points; Dembro Poultry Farm, Sewell, N. J., sixth with the same number of points 99.21; Guy A. Leader and Sons, York, seventh with 99.14 points; Truway Farms, East Berlin, Adams County, eighth with 98.99 points; A. E. Danish, Troy, N. Y., ninth with 98.97 points, and George M. Anthony tenth with 98.93 points.
