New Holland Farmers Fair In 25th Year

Farm Show time is well under way in communities throughout Lancaster County. Some local fairs are now in progress; others already past, and several remain on the fall calendar. Among those scheduled for next week is the New Holland Farmers Fair, one of the most extensive observances of its type in the area. The Farmers Fair, to be held in the borough of New Holland, will run from Wednesday, Oct 3 through Saturday, Oct. 6.

Staged by the New Holland Farmers Day Association, the 1956 annual street fair will mark its 25th anniversary. President Robert O. Whitmore has announced that many special events are being planned for the occasion. In anticipation of the 25th birthday celebration and the expanded Farmers Fair program, the Association expects that all previous attendance records will be surpassed during this year's observance. In the four-day period last season, the Fair drew an estimated 90,000 people.

One highlight of the big birthday party for the Farmers Fair will be the presentation of \$300 in free merchandise certificates, redeemable in New Holland stores and business places. This
