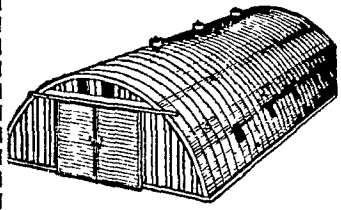

**Angus Bull at 18 Is Equivalent to 116 Human Years**

An agile old bull with the equivalent of 116 human years to his credit still actively heads the registered Aberdeen-Angus herd at Green Hills Farm, Staunton, Va., owned by Glen E. Yount. This animal is probably the oldest purebred beef bull in the United States.

The aged herd sire is Epponian 2nd of Broadview 560598, who celebrated his 18th birthday last June. Normally a beef bull is in service 10 to 12 years at a maximum. There have been 1,745,113 purebred Angus calves registered in America since his birth on June 26, 1938.

Mr Yount bought the bull in the Waverly Farm dispersal on May 23, 1942, and has used him every year since. For a number of years he was run with approximately 50 cows each year, however this number has recently

been reduced. Last spring he was bred to ten cows.

The bull is still very active and unusually sound on his feet and legs. He has always been an active breeder, settling his cows on one service. When young and heavy, he weighed an average of about 1,900 pounds.

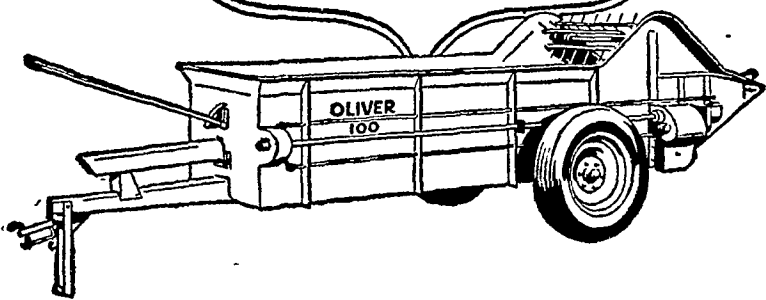

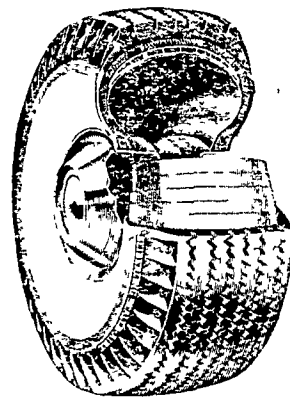
