HARRISBURG - Cool weather during August helped Pennsylvania farm chickens to lay more eggs and they tied the alltime egg production record for the month, the State Department of Agriculture reported today.

The number of layers at 17,-170,000 was almost four per cent below August of last year when the record was set, but the high production rate offset the decline in layers and egg output at 24 million equalled the August 1955 high, Federal-State surveys showed.

Pennsylvania egg production last month was up one per cent from July. Layers in flocks have been increasing since June and now include a substantial number of pullets, the Department


