It's The Law

Q Is it my responsibility or that of the borough to pay for the removal of a large tree in front of my home? This tree is not on my property but is outside the public sidewalk I did not plant this tree Am I liable for any injuries or property damage caused by falling branches? H A W.

A. You should contact the proper borough official about the matter and he will probably tell you how to proceed. Some municipalities have specific ordinances about the removal or trimming of trees, which border public thoroughfares, and you should not proceed without a clearance. Perhaps the borough will remove the tree, if removal is necessary, or it may instruct you to do so. Liability for falling branches would depend on ownership of the tree and the provisions of your local ordinance.

Q. My parents left me a two-story house I occupy the first floor and rent the second floor. I now want to sell the house. The people on the second floor refuse to let me have their key so I can have a duplicate made. They are out most of the time and I have no way of showing the house to prospective purchasers. What can I do in a case like this? C E

A. Your rights depend on the terms of the lease you have with your tenants. You have no right to enter the apartment while it is leased, unless the lease gives you this right. If it does, and the tenants do not cooperate after notice you may have the lock changed, and furnish the tenants with a new key, keeping a duplicate for yourself.

In no event should you ever enter, or have the lock changed, without giving the tenants due notice. If the lease does not give you the right to enter, you may have to institute eviction proceedings. Your attorney could advise you as to the best procedure under the circumstances.

Q Is a girl 18 years who lives with her parents required by law to give her pay check to them or

is she entitled to keep her pay and give them board? M. L. M.
A. There is no process of law by which the parents can compel the daughter to give her pay check to them. If she is emancipated and earning her own way, her parents are no longer bound to support and maintain her, and thus may properly charge her a fair sum for board and room and other services, but they have no right to the entire pay check.

Q Can a wife get a loan from a bank without the signature of the husband? If so, who is responsible in the event she cannot meet the payments? C K.

A. The wife may obtain a loan on her individual signature if the bank is willing to make such a loan. The willingness of the bank would probably depend on whether the wife holds any substantial amount of property in her own name. If the bank does make the loan on the wife's signature alone, then she is solely responsible for the debt and the husband's property cannot be attached.

Q Is there a law in Pennsylvania that a farmer must build a fence to keep his cattle on his farm? H.W.H.

A. In Pennsylvania a farmer may not permit his livestock to roam on another's land — if he does, he is liable for the damages caused to the other's property. Accordingly, it is the farmer's duty to restrain his cattle in some manner, and a fence is the most practical solution.

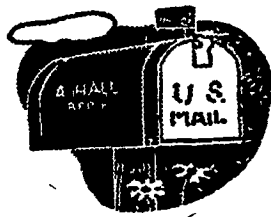
