

Acreage Reserve Pay What's become of Washington's To Oct. 12 \$68 Million

Washington - (USDA) Payments to farmers participating in the 1956 Acreage Reserve program of the Soil Bank totaled \$68,501,532.59 in 41 States reporting through Oct 12, 1956, the U.S. Department Agriculture announced today

This is the third report on payments (negotiable certificates) issued under the 1956 Acreage Reserve program. The second report, covering payments through Sept. 28, showed total of \$18,087,212.76 disbursed in the 39 States from which reports were received.

In the final report on participation in the 1956 Acreage Reserve program (USDA 2464-56) the maximum amount of payments farmers could carn by remaining in compliance with the program was placed at nearly \$261 million. Since then, the Department has authorized the termination or modification of 1956 Acreage Reserve agreements by farmers who misunderstood the terms of the program.

Too much supervision adding "little or nothing" to actual education is responsible in part for higher education costs, the Lancaster County Pomona Grange charged Saturday night in a meeting at Brickerville.

Higher costs of education are being paid largely by owners of real estate, who are finding taxation becoming a real burden." Some of this stems from employment of too many non-teaching supervisors.
