Broilers Thursday Off One-Tenth Of a Cent, Averaging 17.92 Cents

Lancaster Poultry Exchange (Hohrerstown, Pa.) (Sales Report, Sale 184, Thursday, Oct. 18, 1956) — Ranging from 17 to 19.25 cents, 43 lots of a total 122,055 broilers Thursday last week sold here in a range of 17 to 19.25 cents, averaging 17.92. Listed were 53 lots, 139,230 birds, offered 52 lots, 138,530 and sold, 46 lots, 126,980. One lot of 525 Leghorn fowl brought 10.25, one lot of 3900 capettes 20 cents and one lot of 500 capettes 21.75.

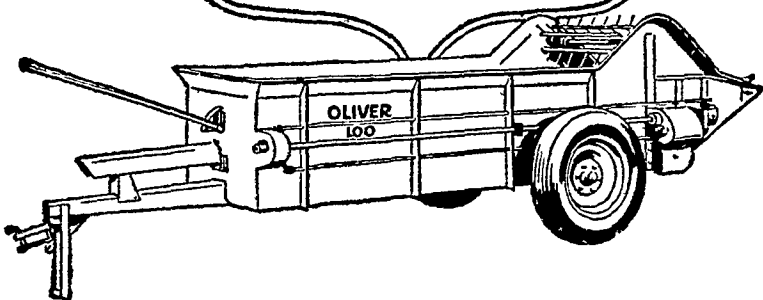
