Out-Of-Season Big Game Ends License

Game Commission records show that many persons have recently been prosecuted for the illegal killing or possessing of deer in closed season. Some of the guilty appeared surprised at learning there was more than a cash penalty or jail sentence involved. The law provides that when big game has been killed in closed season

1. It shall be mandatory that anyone hunting, killing, wounding, transporting, concealing, or having in possession a deer taken in closed season shall lose his hunting and trapping privileges for three years.

2 It shall be mandatory that anyone found guilty of hunting, killing or attempting to kill, possess, etc, a bear in closed season shall lose his hunting and trapping privileges for five years.

Cash penalties remain at \$100 for each deer and \$200 for each bear illegally killed or possessed, in or out of season, or one day in jail for every-dollar of costs and fine imposed.

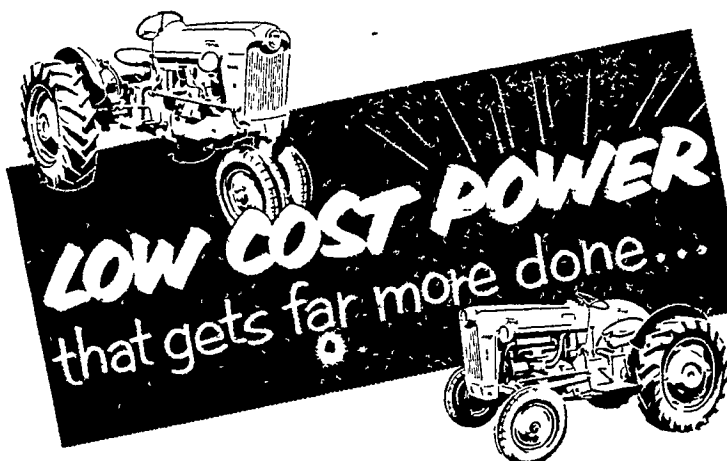
