This 5 by 8 inch booklet is titled Pennsylvania Waterfowl Identification Guide. The cost is 10c. It may be obtained from the Harrisburg office of the Game Commission or any of the agency's field division offices.

#### Follow Pointers For Sleeve Fit

Follow these pointers when fitting garment sleeves

The sleeve cap should fit smoothly into the armseye seam with no gathers, but with ease to give a comfortable and smooth appearance Ease in fullness across cap and upper arm varies as to sleeve type The set-in sleeve should have two inches ease at fullest part of upper

Bernice J Tharp, extens on clothing specialist of the Penn-3ylvania State University, suggests distributing the gathers to allow the ease of fabric over the elbows in long-fitted sleeves When using darks, the middle dart should point to the elbow When the arm is bent toward the neckline or held even with the bustline, the hem of the longfitted sleeve should reach the wrist bone comfortably


