Just a week earlier, Connie's ten-year-old brother, Jimmy, Jr., placed first in the Southeast District 4-H Baby Beef Round-Up at Lancaster Union Stock Yards, with a Hereford. They are the son and daughter of Mr and Mrs James Quesenberry, and both are students at Stewartstown.

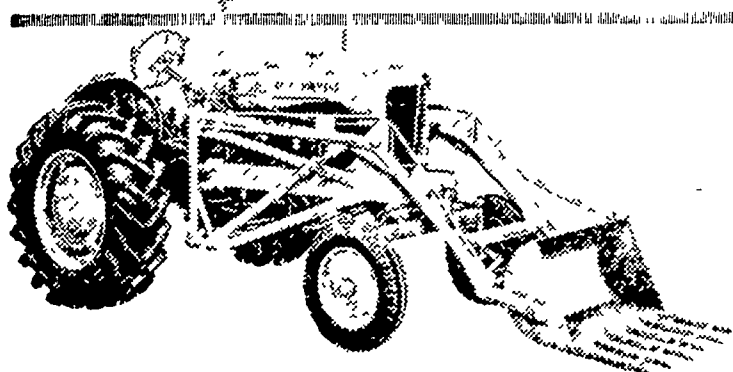

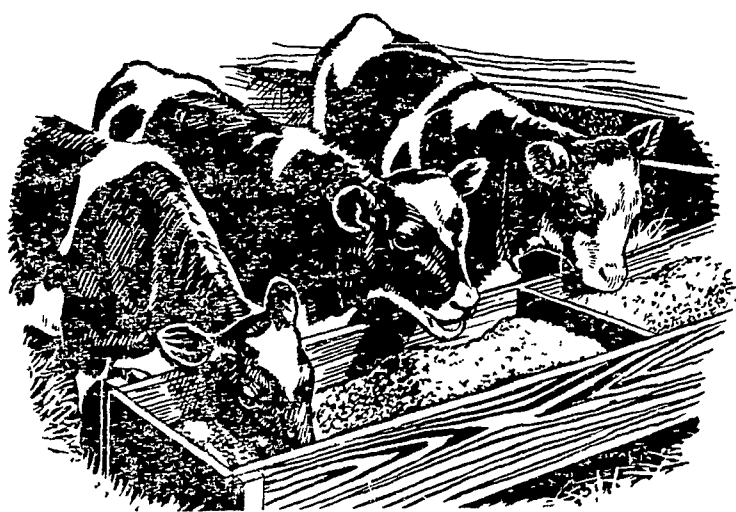
