
Hamburger Purchase, 9.9 Million Pounds, Aids Cattle Producer

WASHINGTON - (USDA) -The U S Department of Agri culture in the week of Nov 1 purchased 9,906,000 lbs of frozen assist cattle producers, particularly during the period of heavy grass cattle marketings. Purchases since buying began in late September now total 46,778,-000 lbs.



Haste and Rush Often Cause of **Holiday Mishaps**

Harrisburg — Motorists today were cautioned "not to shop for holiday accidents."

The advice came from Col E. Henry, Pennsylvania State Poice Commissioner

"While no driver is likely to go out looking for an accident to spoil his holiday season, our records show this is a time of year when accidents occur pretty easily," he declared.

"Many families visit neighboring communities on shopping nights, in search for gifts that may not be found in the home town," the state official pointed out. Folks from suburbs and small communities will be driving to the nearest city to see garly decorated windows and join the holiday throngs for an exciting evening "

Such a trip can be a wonderful experience, Col Henry observed. But for some, he warned, such a trip in previous years has ended in tragedy because of someone's thoughtlessness or forgetfulness.

"Be content to take it easydriving to your destination, walking about in the shopping district, and returning home at a reasonable time without going too fast," Col Henry said -

"And don't load the back window ledge with packages that obstruct your view through the rear window

"Don't indulge in the use of intoxicants during your trip Liquor never yet has helped make any person a better driver Persons who enjoy taking a nip should wait until the end of their

Motorists also were cautioned, "Don't double-park, because one illegally parked vehicle can tie up traffic for blocks, causing tempers to flare and possibly leading to a traffic summons for the guilty

As a precaution against cold veather, drivers were reminded o winterize their vehicles. "Before taking the family on a trip, or even before driving any distance alone, make sure your battery has been checked, your brakes safe, your tires are good, your tire chains are in the car ready for use if necessary, your lights are functioning properly, your windshield wiper blades and defrosters are dependable, and your turn signal indicators are in working order."

"Our holiday will be as safe as we make it," Col. Henry concluded.

Lima Bean Acreage Lowest in 12 Years Over Pennsylvania

Harrisburg - The Pennsysvania acreage of lima beans for canning and freezing this past season was the smallest in 12 years, but yield per acre at 1,500 pounds of shelled beans was 300 pounds higher than last year and 240 pounds above average.

Federal-State surveys as of November 1, announced by the State Department of Agriculture, showed state production of 2,320 tons, compared with 2,400 tons in 1955 and the 10-year 1945-54 average of 2,690 tons. The acreage picked was 3,100 compared with 4,000 acres last year.

Adverse weather early in the season retarded early fall cabbage intended for fresh market but an excellent October was beneficial. Production is estimated at 15,200 tons compared with 12,800 tons last year.

Cutting of broccoli for fresh marketing will continue in small volume until about December 1. 000 crates, 2,000 above fast year. The carrot crop of 340,000 bushels is the same as last year. Early fall spinach output at 465,-1 000 bushels is 11,000 bushels less than in 1955.

Red Meat Output To New High in 1957

Harrisburg - Production of Down 10 P.C. red meats by commercial slaughter plants in Pennsylvania was the highest of record for the first nine months of this year, the State Department of Agriculture said recently following Federal-tate surveys.

The total of 660 million pounds of dressed weight of beef cattle, calves, hogs, sheep and lambs was three per cent above production for the same period last year, the Department said

Red meat production in Pennsylvania for the month of September was 738 million pounds, slightly below August output and five per cent under September


September slaughterings in the State included 74,000 head of beef cattle, 73,000 calves, 220,000 hogs and 27,000 sheep and lambs

Chick Output

HARRISBURG, Nov - A decline of 10 per cent in production of a baby chicks at commercial hatcheries in Pennsylvania is reported for the month of October compared with the same month last year

Federal-State surveys announc ed by the State Department of Agriculture showed an October output of 3,614,000 chicks of which 29 million were of the broiler-fryer type, down nine per cent There was a sharp decline in all chicks from the 4.2 million produced in September.

During the first 10 months of this year Pennsylvania chick pro duction totaled 78 millions com pared with- 67 million for the same period last year.
