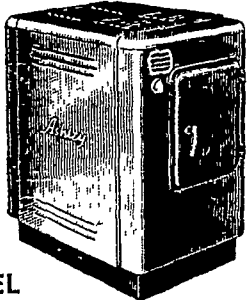

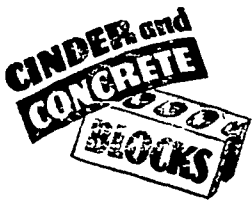

European Food Curtailed with Bad Weather

WASHINGTON — (USDA) — Europe will need increased imports of food this season as result of a harvest reduced by frozes early in 1956, and bad weather at harvest time The 1955-56 growing season started well, and in most countries acreage sown by January 1, 1956, equaled or exceeded the area sown a year earlier The entire Continent experience exceptionally cold weather in February and early March, however Most regions had enough snow cover to protect field crops, but in France, the Low Countries and Switzerland large acreages of the fall-sown crops were killed In Sweden, the winter rapeseed crop crop was almost wiped out

Citrus trees in Spain suffered severe injury. Almonds crops in Spain, France and Italy were hard hit. Olive trees in some parts of the Mediterranean region were hurt, and vineyards in France Switzerland, Austria and Western Germany suffered frost damage. Many countries had heavy truck crop losses, and meadows and pastures were hurt considerably in Denmark, the Low Countries, France and Western Germany.

European bread-grain production may be down from last year about 10 per cent, with the millable quantity showing a greater drop France, a large net exporter of wheat the past two seasons will be a large importer in 1957 Europe's feed-grain production may be up 5 per cent but hay crops were so generally poor that winter feed supplies may be short Europe's small cotton crop is above 1955, and a decline in seed oil production is not expected to offset the probable in-

crease in olive oil output Output of fruit, especially citrus and pomes, will be down.
