### Poultry Products Use Group in Conference

Washington — (USDA) — The task group on poultry products and by-products appointed to advise the President's bipartisan Commission on Increased Industrial Use of Agricultural Products will hold its second meeting in Chicago, Ill., on Jan. 3-4, the Commission announced today. The group first met on Nov. 29, also in Chicago.

This Task Group on Poultry Products, one of 10 such advisory

groups announced so far by the Commission, has been asked to review the technical and economic position of poultry products and by-products, to appraise current and planned research on utilization of these commodities, and to submit an advisory report for consideration by the Commission in making recommendations to Congress designed to increase industrial uses of farm products.

Chairman of the group is Dr. Cliff D. Carpenter, president, Institute of American Poultry Industries, Chicago, Ill.
