

THE WEATHER BUREAU'S 30-day outlook for mid-December to mid-January calls for temperatures to average below seasonal normals over northern portions of the nation lying between the Appalachians and the Continental Divide. Above normal temperatures are expected to prevail along the Gulf Coast, in the Southeast, and also over the far Southwest. In areas

not specified near normal averages with large fluctuations are in prospect. Precipitation is predicted to equal or exceed normal over most of the nation except for subnormal amounts in the Northern Plains and the Southwest. Much of the precipitation in Central and Northern areas will be in the form of snow.

Q. Is it legal to charge interest on a loan without a license in Pennsylvania? What is the legal rate of interest that can be charged? FM.

A. You cannot engage in the loan business without a license, but if you loan money to a friend or business acquaintance occasionally, no license is necessary, and you may charge interest on the loan up to the rate of 6 per cent. Anything above 6 per cent is uncollectable.

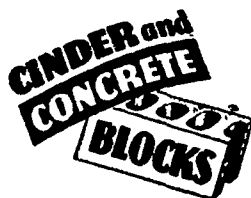
