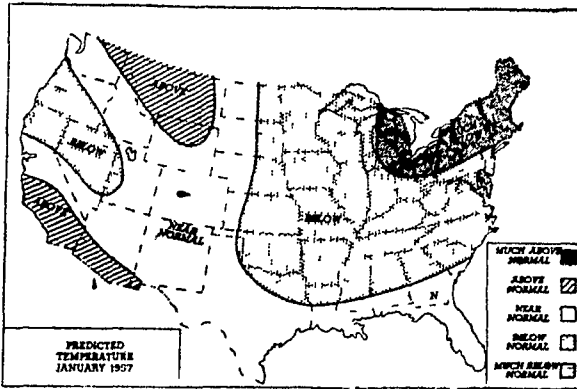

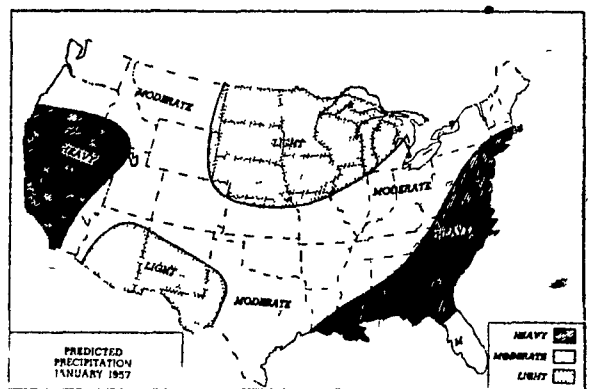

Increased Use of Farm Products Goal Of New Commission

WASHINGTON — (USDA) — The Task Group on Industrial Uses for Grain other Than Alcohol, appointed by the President's bipartisan Commission on Increased Industrial Uses of Agricultural Products, held its first meeting Dec. 4 at the Commission's offices in the U. S. Department of Agriculture Building, Washington, D. C.

Chairman of the 11-member group is T. S. Carswell of Commercial Solvents Corporation, New York, N. Y. This task group is the sixth advisory body appointed so far by the Commission. Other such groups have been named to advise the Commission on cotton; sugar; hides, skins, and animal by-products; oilseeds and animal fats; and new and special crops. The Com-

mission expects to announce soon the appointment of similar advisory groups to study other agricultural commodity and use area, including a task group on industrial alcohol from grain.

Job of the group concerned with industrial uses for grain other than alcohol is to review the technical and economic status of grain utilization, and to submit an advisory report on its findings for consideration by the Commission in making recommendations to Congress that will bring about increased industrial uses for farm products.

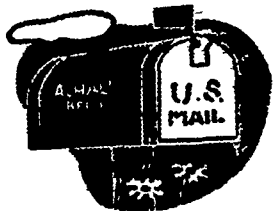
