

Broilers Hit Highest Market Price Since July 12 in Lancaster Exchange

LANCASTER, Jan 31 — (Lancaster Poultry Exchange, sales report 199) — Broiler prices averaged 22.19 cents for a big jump in the market from the previous week's auction. This is the highest level that broiler prices have reached since last July 12.

The 1956 high was set exactly one year ago, when the average hit 24½ cents a pound. The number of broilers sold was 161,135 as compared with last week's 162,850.

Prices paid were. Broilers, 21¼ to 23¼ cents, averaging 22.19 cents for 161,135 birds.

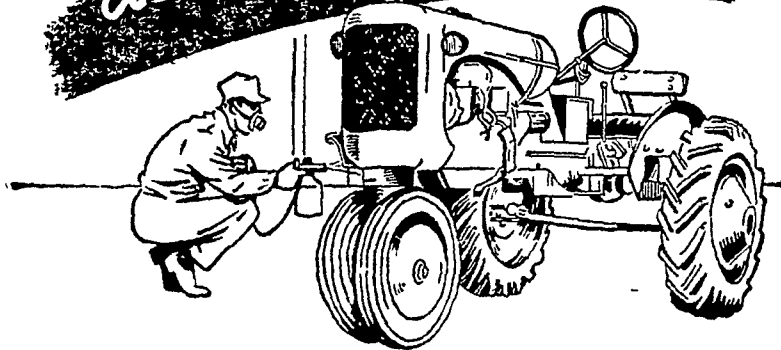

Heifers in small supply fully steady to strong, cows and bulls both fully steady. Stockers and feeders slow mostly steady with last Wednesday.

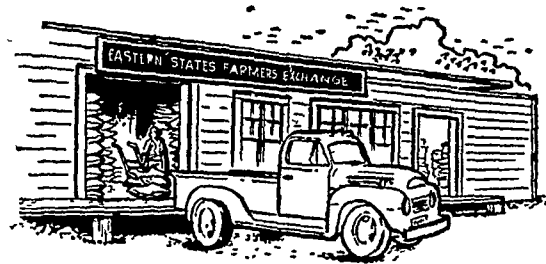
