

Broiler Price Nearly Steady At Lancaster Exchange Thursday

LANCASTER, Feb. 21 (Lancaster Poultry Exchange, sales report 202) — Broiler prices paid at today's auction were mostly steady with the sale last week while about 20,000 more birds were sold.

At the corresponding sale a year ago, 67,925 birds were sold with a Tuesday average of 23.23 cents and a Thursday average of 23.42 cents.

Prices paid at today's auction

were Broilers, 19 1/4 cents to 22 1/2 cents, average 20.05 cents for 34 lots, 133,025 birds.

Lancaster Markets: Stock Offered In Lower Number, Prices Steady

LANCASTER, Feb. 28, CATTLE: 2,775, week ago 3,120. Slaughter steers supply some smaller than the previous week. Larger percentage of good and low choice grades. Slaughter steers slow mostly steady, some sales 25 cents higher than last Wednesday.

Heifers scarce steady, cows around 25 cents higher. Stockers and feeders moderately active early fully steady. Receipts comprised around 38 loads slaughter steers, three loads heifers. Approximately 50 per cent of the total was stockers and feeders and 10 per cent cows.

Bulk choice fed steers 1,000-1,300 lbs. \$20-21.50, one load high choice 1,366 lb. steers \$21.65, load 1,111 lb. high choice steers \$23.25. Two loads western rail-shipped average to high prime fed steers \$25.25, ten head \$25.75. Good to low choice steers and yearlings \$18.50-20.25. Standard Holsteins down to \$16.75. Most standard and good heifers \$15-19.25.

Utility cows largely \$12-13.25, canners and cutters mostly \$9.25-

12.50, high yielding cutters to \$13. Utility and commercial bulls \$15-18, a few good fed yearling bulls \$19.50. Medium and good stocker and feeder steers and yearlings 534-1,000 lbs. \$16.50-19.50. Common stock steers \$14-15.50. A few lots good stock steer calves and light yearlings \$19-22.

CALVES: 871, week ago 908. Compared with last Wednesday, veal calves around \$1 lower, standard to low choice hardest to sell. Bulk good and choice vealers \$23.75-32, a few prime to \$34. Utility and standard \$14-23.

HOGS: 1,777, week ago 1,424. Barrows and gilts steady to 25 cents higher, than last Wednesday, sows fully steady. Barrows and gilts mixed U.S. 2 and 3, 190-
