## Sport Shirts Are Good Buys If Guaranteed

Recent studies show sport shirts are bought on the spur of the moment, indicating a trend toward impulse buying. Attractive packaging, and attention-getting displays combine to make quick purchases easy.

It pays to think through clothing needs. Estimate money available for needed clothing and plan purchases carefully, reminds Miss Ruth Kimble, extension home economist, Lancaster county.

Sport shirts are important clothing items because they're worn so often. The shirt should be attractive, well cut, and of good color and design for the figure type and face shape. The horizontal design lines of the collar tend to shorten and broaden the appearance of the face. Select a style that creates a longer line through use of the longer collar points and use of stripes in an up and down direction.

The grade or quality of the fabric determines the length of service because of the firm, even weave or construction of fabric. If knitted, the finishes used should make the shirt resistant to stretching or shrinkage, loss of color, fraying of seams, and chipping of buttons.

Labels with a guarantee the fabric will shrink less than one per cent indicate a safe buy. Vat dye colors resist color loss from washing and sunlight. Mercerizing gives a luster to cotton yarns, making the fabric soft and preventing or minimizing dust or soil.
