(Continued from page 12) is pruned in the winter and early spring before the buds start to open.

Pines, on the other hand, must be pruned in late June and early July.

Pruning is what makes the difference between a well shaped, full thick tree and an uneven open tree. If the tree is allowed to grow, for even one year, without pruning, it will tend to be open and thin.

The value of this type tree is low, and in times of extreme competition, may find sale only as boughs.

Marketing the trees is also a big factor to be considered. The U.S. Department of Agriculture recommends that the prospective grower locate his future market well in advance.

Competition in the market is keen now and with the expected influx of Soil Bank growers, it will become keener,

will lead an all-breed tour of urebred cattle producers to the Sydney Royal Show in Australia n April, continuing around the world.




