Compared with last Wednesday, slaughter steers and heifers unevenly 25-75 cents higher, some sales \$1 up. Most advance on choice and prime grades. Around 40 per cent of the supply was stocker and feeder steers and nearly 10 per cent cows. Slaughter steers graded mostly good and choice.

Bulk choice slaughter steers 1,000-1,300 lbs. \$23-24.50, high choice and mixed high choice and prime \$24.75-26, two loads 1,237 lbs. average prime \$26.40. Load 1,375 lb. high choice and prime \$25. Good and low choice steers and yearlings \$20.50-22.75, some standard and low good \$18.50-20. A few standard and good heifers \$16.50-21, a few head choice \$22.75. Utility and commercial


