Phosphate Fertilizer Helps Summer Pasture

In an experiment conducted recently by the University of Kentucky, the application of about \$5.40 worth of phosphate fertilizer on Sudan grass produced an extra 3,500 pounds of forage, according to Agronomist E. C. Doll of the Kentucky agricultural experiment station.

In the Kentucky experiment, 1 land to which no phosphorus was added averaged only 1,400 pounds of dry matter per acre. When 150 pounds of 20 per cent superphosphate were added, production per acre went up to 3,800 pounds, and when 450 pounds of superphosphate were applied, production soared to 4,900 pounds.
