RHUBARB FRITTERS Mrs. Amos L. Keener, R1 Lititz

1½ cups flour

- 2 tablespoons baking powder
- (scant) 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 6 tablespons sugar
- 1 egg
- 3/2 cup milk 1 cup finely diced rhubarb

Mix ingredients and beat two minutes. Drop tablespoons of batter into deep hot fat. Fry until well browned. Serve sprinkled ing dish, cover with four cups with confectioners sugar.

RHUBARB BATTER PUDDING Mrs. Amos L. Keener, R1 Lititz

Cut into short lengths enough red rhubarb to make one pint, add one cupful plumped raisins, one cupful of sugar and one-fourth teaspoon of ground nutmeg or. cinnamon. Mix fruit, sugar and spices together and put into buttered baking dish. Make batter as follows:

- ½ cup milk
- 2 eggs
- 1 tablespoon butter melted
- 3 tablespons sugar
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1½ cups flour

Mix in usual way and pour over fruit mixtures Serve with orange or lemon sauce or cream. Plump seedless raisins in wire strainer over boiling water in covered kettle.
