Minnesota Declared Brucellosis Free

On June 3 acting Secretary of Agriculture True D Morse notified Gov Orville Freeman of Minnesota that his state had been declared modified certified brucellosis free This means that the disease is present in not more than one per cent of Minnesota's cattle and not more than five per cent of the herds

Minnesota is the seventh state to achieve a modified ceitified bruccllosis free statues, the other states being Delaware, Maine, New Hampshire, North 'Carolina, Washington and Winconsin In addition, 374 counties in 26

other states and in Puerto Rico have achived this status

The club members were treat ed to a sight seldom seen by visitors to a power plant One turbogenerator was being torn down for annual overhaud and nspection, thus giving the voungsters a chance to see the intricate turbine blading and in terior construction

At the dairy plant they saw a farmer owned enterprise that serves an area of 10,000 square miles in Pennsylvania and New Jersev

The plant, which employs more than 400 workers, was started in 1934 Since that time milk receipts have grown 159




